THE FUTURE OF DRAYTON **COAL MINE AND THE DRAYTON SOUTH PROJECT** IS AGAIN THE SUBJECT OF MUCH SPECULATION WITH ANGLO AMERICAN ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH MALABAR COAL TO SELL THEIR 88.17% SHARE

TON SOUTH

Anglo American ceased mining activities at the Drayton mine during 2016 and the loss of jobs hurt the community. When the South Drayton project was refused by the PAC for the 4th time in February and Anglo American declaring they would not make another application, many thought that was the end for Drayton South.

With the news of the sale many are of the opinion that Malabar Coal would not have agreed to the purchase without intending to pursue the project. The equine industry believe this to be the

case and have made it clear that they will fight any applications.

The proposed project would see 500 jobs and 15 years of coal production and although each application was approved by the Department of Planning and Environment it was refused by the PAC because of the believed risk to the local horse studs and environmental concerns.

At this time all Anglo American have said about the sale is that it is subject to several conditions and its terms are confidential.

A BIG DEAL

The deal will see Thiess undertake mining operations at the Muswellbrook mine until 2021 and services will include mine planning and engineering.

Thiess Managing Director, Michael Wright said the company was proud to develop the world class Mount Pleasant coal operation.

"Our focus is on achieving successful outcomes for our clients and the community," he said. "We are very pleased to continue our long-standing presence in the Hunter Valley."

This great link between mining and Rugby League is one of the reasons the Knights host the Voice for Mining Family Day in Newcastle every year. It's an awesome event that brings together


two significant contributors to the Hunter community.



GOES A LONG WAY

KOMATSU LIMITED HAS PURCHASED JOY GLOBAL INC. FOR \$2.89 BILLION. THAT'S A HECK OF A LONG WAY FROM WHERE IT ALL BEGAN.

In 1895, 12-year-old Joseph Francis Joy went to work as a slate picker in a coal mine in Cumberland, Maryland, which eventually led to him working underground with a range of hand held augers, picks and shovels.

It sparked a passion in him for ways to mechanise the coal mining progress (or perhaps he was simply looking for ways to make his own job easier) and in 1919 he obtained his first patent on a gathering arm type loader and Joy Mining Machinery was born.

Over his lifetime, Joy accumulated 190 patents and his major inventions were recognised at

milestones in the history of underground mining mechanisation. He pioneered new concepts in hydraulics, modern control and power circuits, trackless mining equipment, efficient gearing and seal designs and many other industry firsts. His company Joy Mining Machinery is the largest producer of high productivity underground mining machinery in the world and accounts for over half of Joy Global's total revenue. Komatsu has not only purchased a company which is a world leader in mining, but also has played an instrumental part in making mining what it is today.





REMEMBER OUR MINERS

LAST MONTH WE DID A STORY ON COAL MINER JOSEPH HENRY LITTLEFIELD 'HARRY', WHO LEFT HIS MINERS LAMP BEHIND AT NEATH HOTEL WHEN HE WENT OFF TO FIGHT IN WORLD WAR 1. THAT WAS ONLY THE START OF HARRY'S STORY AND MANY MINERS JUST LIKE HIM.

Harry and many other survivors of Gallipoli were then thrown into an insane battle in July 1916 in Pozières France. 16,000 men were wounded and 7,000 were killed. Of those who sacrificed their lives, 4,112 of them have never been found or identified. This is over 12% of the losses for Australia in WW1 and it happened in only 6 weeks.

The Battle has never been commemorated by Australia and the tremendous sacrifice made by these young Australian men is largely unknown to most of us.

Barry Gracey is the President of the Pozières Remembrance Association which was established to bring the recognition that is deserved to these men and ensure their legacy lives on.

When an entrenching tool was recently discovered at the site and given to Barry he realised that the digging tool could have belonged to Harry or a young miner just like him and so he decided to present it to the Neath Hotel where it could sit with Harry's mining lamp and commemorate his memory.

AWARE OF THE CONTRIBUTION

CFMEU TO BE A PART OF THIS
MEMORABLE MOMENT.

Barry said, "Many miners like Harry didn't come home when they could have because they wanted to stay and help their mates. Their history has been overlooked so it's great to see the support of CFMEU."

CFMEU were honored to be part of the presentation with members Todd Hardy and David Simm presenting Neath Hotel owners David and Michelle Horton with the shovel and a certificate.

Todd said it was important to recognise all the miners who sacrificed their lives and the story of Harry and all his comrades should not be forgotten.


"These miners fought for what they believed in alongside their mates and in doing so many of them gave up their lives. It's now over 100 years later but being there for your mates is still what we are all about."





MINING DIALOGUE FOLLOWING THE APPOINTMENT OF WELL-KNOWN LOCAL DI SNEDDON TO THE DIALOGUE'S KEY STRATEGY GROUP.

Mrs Sneddon was selected from applicants to join the Dialogue's Joint Advisory Steering Committee (JASC) to fill a vacancy created by the recent resignation of Dr John Drinan.

As with Dr Drinan, Mrs Sneddon has been involved with the Dialogue since its inception in 2011 including facilitating the Dialogue's last two annual workshops.

The JASC is responsible for guiding the Dialogue's strategy; on it Mrs Sneddon joins fellow community members Gill Eason and Jim Morgan.

THE FOREIGN INVESTMENT REVIEW BOARD (FIRB) HAS APPROVED YANCOAL'S \$3.2 BILLION ACQUISITION OF RIO TINTO'S HUNTER VALLEY COAL ASSETS.

It's been a media frenzy lately with much speculation about whether the sale, which was announced back in February, would be approved by the Australian government and whether it would be able to raise the required capital.

With some voicing the opinion that the government would not approve the sale as it would give too large a monopoly on coal assets to the Chinese owned company, that speculation has been laid to rest with the Australian Government's foreign investment watchdog having no

objection to it purchasing Coal & Allied Industries.

The FIRB approval is "a critical milestone", according to Yancoal Chief Executive Officer Reinhold Schmidt. "The FIRB approval is a positive step forward for Yancoal, its shareholders and the Hunter Valley, demonstrating the Australian Government's support for continued investment into the local resources sector."

The acquisition remains subject to additional conditions, including approval from shareholders of Rio Tinto and Yancoal's majority owner, Yanzhou Coal Mining.

YOU WON'T FIND TWO JOBS FURTHER APART THAN UNDERGROUND MINER AND PILO BUT FOR SUCCESSFUL LOCAL BUSINESSMAN BEN WYNDAM, BOTH COMBINED TO BECOME AN INSTRUMENTAL PART OF HIS LIFE AND CAREER JOURNEY.

As the owner of successful Scone based airline Airspeed Aviation, Scone Chamber of Commerce President, ex underground miner and lifelong flying enthusiast, Ben talked to us about how his day job now sees him flying high rather than digging deep.

Ben became a qualified pilot at the age of 23. Discussing his journey Ben said, "I was asked to set up a charter service for Valley Longwall before things got tough around August 2001 and 9/11 and I got a start working on drill rigs underground for what I thought would be a few months. 6 or 7 years later I was still there. Ben told us with a laugh about some of his 'infamous' mining mates but said the best stories need to be kept untold to protect those still alive. As for flying, his most famous passenger has been Bob Hawke. "Bob is a very entertaining and genuine guy and the chance to chat for so long was an opportunity I'll never forget. Along with mining charters we also regularly fly pollies around and do work with TV shows like Getaway so interesting passengers are part of the job," said Ben.

He told us his scariest moment in the sky was flying across Australia at night and looking down to see these great big areas of white which he thought was fog, meaning he had nowhere to land and not much fuel. Ben then realised it was salt plains, but not before spending an hour or so thinking he was stuffed. His scariest moment as a miner was in the Kyooga box cut which collapsed within minutes of him being there.

Life these days revolves around family; the business and being an active part of a small-town community where you can make a difference.





WATCH THIS **SPACE**

THE IDEA OF MINING RAW MATERIALS FROM ASTEROIDS HAS BEEN AROUND FOR A WHILE. BUT WHAT'S THE LIKELIHOOD OF IT HAPPENING?

It's more than a likelihood, in fact it's Transforming asteroid water expected that within the next decade asteroid mining will no longer just be an idea from science fiction novels

Already there is fierce competition in the space mining industry as companies come up with ambitious plans to tap into outer space resources. Deep Space Industries, Kepler Energy and Space Engineering, Moon Express and Planetary Resources are all busy working on a variety of projects and launches are already under way in exploratory missions.

The initial goal of most companies is to provide basic resources for space travelers or robotic space operations. Space mining is not just about mining asteroids for rare metals or resources and bringing them back to Earth. There's also a lot of value in keeping the resources in space and using them to continue exploration and even colonisation.

WHAT WILL WE BE MINING?

It's a risky and expensive business sending resources into space, even basics like water. To send an Olympic size swimming pool full of water into space would cost about \$1 billion. Water is used not only to sustain life, but for also for cooling systems and the two components of water hydrogen and oxygen, are the main components of rocket fuel.

into rocket fuel will make a huge difference to our space going capabilities and with many of the 13,000 near earth asteroids being made up of around 20 percent water there is no shortage available.

As for rare metals, the moon alone is estimated to contain trillions of dollars in valued materials such as helium3, titanium and platinum.

WHY AREN'T WE ALREADY MINING? The main holdup is the cost of launching and transporting. Even with the reduced launch costs thanks to SpaceX and Blue Origin, sending anything into space remains hugely expensive. The cost of space transportation needs to drastically reduce before it will be economical to transport minerals back to Earth.

Most experts believe it's only a matter of time before the space mining industry overcomes the hurdles of transportation and successfully utilising water for fuel

As the industry grows a space mining supply chain would naturally develop following the same practices as what our terrestrial mining companies follow - exploration, development, operations, and closure. Skills in our industry will be sought after and who knows, maybe some of us will be putting them to use among the stars.



HORSING AROUND

PIT PONIES WERE USED IN UNDERGROUND COAL MINES FROM THE MID-18TH UNTIL THE MID-20TH CENTURY AND THEY PLAYED A VITAL ROLE IN THE COAL MINING INDUSTRY THAT HAS GONE LARGELY UNRECOGNISED.

The term 'pit pony' came from the small hardy breeds of ponies used in British and European mines. Here in the Hunter, where our coal seams tended to be thicker meaning higher tunnels, larger breeds of horses were commonly used such as Clydesdales.

The main use of pit ponies was to haul coal to the surface, pulling heavy skips of coal along tracks out of the mine.

In the early days, a wheeler was a young boy of around 14 who would lead the pit pony through the mine tunnels to collect the coal and then take it up to the surface. The horses responded to voice commands and knew their way through the tunnels and back to their stables. Conditions for pit ponies changed throughout the years and at different collieries, with their treatment generally improving as time went on. Some ponies would spend their entire lives working underground and never see the surface while others would spend the working week underground and rest in underground stables at night and only be brought to the surface for a weekend

of rest in the mines paddocks. Others were returned to the surface at the end of each day, washed down. fed and reshod when required.


During their working life, the pit ponies formed strong bonds with their handlers and the other miners around them. Their even temperament made them suitable for the never-ending darkness and loud noises.

THE SIXTH SENSE OF THESE ANIMALS SAVED THE LIFE OF MANY A MINER.

There are many stories of ponies who refused to enter a section of mine that subsequently collapsed soon after. Some miners said the horses knew exactly what time knock-off was and refused to take another load, and most agreed that they intuitively knew when it was time for crib.

Horses played such an important part in our coal mining history and for most miners they were so much more than a mere tool and became dear companions instead.

The last pit ponies used in Australia were retired in 1990 but their contribution should never be forgotten.







Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) programs are becoming the wave of the future as we introduce our children to the skills needed to keep pace in our technologically driven world.

Allan Perry is the Science & Technology Teacher at ACCS who recognised the importance of STEM programs and came up with the idea for a robotics program for his students. Coal & Allied helped make the idea a reality by funding the program with the required Lego Mindstorm products, software and curriculum support material.

Travis Bates, Coal & Allied Community Relations Specialist said that they could see the potential in a program like this immediately when Allan approached them. Guy has purchased for Singleton Physiotherapy a range of Class 1 Medical devices that have the tick of approval from the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration. They accurately measure pain, mobility, strength and flexibility and use computers to monitor and analyse every moment in real time.

"These machines allow us to evaluate, monitor and resolve a person's problem in a way that exceeds options currently available." Guy said.

"A lot of the time back pain sufferers receive treatment but then go out and get hurt again, but this rehabilitation treatment uses preventative treatment methods. Mines do a lot of maintenance on equipment to make sure it's working in perfect order. You could look at this as doing maintenance on people, which I believe is more important."

These machines will be a big part of the research Guy will be doing and will hopefully provide answers on the issue of back pain in our industry. Singleton Physiotherapy is also offering a free introductory assessment with the machines for people who are suffering from back, shoulder or neck problems.

Flop me, that can't be right, the ink is as much as I just paid for my printer! Now suddenly, you're managing your print runs by page, printing in greyscale and your kids are now banned from using the printer unless it is deemed critical to their future development. **WHAT'S THIS ALL GOT TO DO WITH MINING**

AND EARTHMOVING EQUIPMENT? Absolutely nothing, until you

consider the strategies used to entice customers to purchase, operate and maintain their equipment. Let's face it, we all like things shiny and new, even more so when it's the real deal, made by the company, for the people. There's nothing like the feeling you get when you unwrap that original

part for your treasured machine. In a report published by Macquarie Equities Research they lifted the bonnet on some of the large machinery manufacturers to understand what made them tick and more importantly, where they made their money. Macquarie's findings revealed that the profit margins for their maintenance and spare parts operations are higher than those attained when selling equipment. They go on to highlight that this type of revenue tends to be less prone to downturns (think about all the existing machines operating in Australia today), providing companies with a steady and reliable source of revenue.

How does this apply to me I hear you ask? According to one of the 'Big 3' Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM's), the revenue generated from maintenance (including components and parts) through the life cycle of equipment tends to be two to

and rebuilt components as well as replacing non-core parts with nongenuine options.

Now, we all know that upfront savings don't always result in long-term cost effective outcomes however, if managed right, they can achieve incremental savings with similar, if not, better results. I'm a fan and believe in the merits that such solutions provide if you do your homework. Just like my printer, if you asked me if I'd use refillable ink over plug and play cartridges, I'd have to admit I'm a sucker for the real deal.






PIE MINISTER INTRODUCES **NEW TAXES AND LAWS**
