## BUDGET **BOOST**

THE RECENTLY RELEASED NSW BUDGET CLEARLY SHOWS THE IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTION THE HUNTER MINING INDUSTRY MAKES TO THE STATE ECONOMY. THIS CONTRIBUTION HAS HELPED NSW INTO A STRONG ECONOMIC POSITION, AND WE NEED TO ENSURE THE HUNTER ALSO BENEFITS.

Royalties from the mining sector have been revised up by \$813 million, and will deliver a record \$1.8 billion this year alone, and another record \$2 billion next year to help fund improved services across the state. Mining royalties are expected to deliver around \$7.4 billion in revenue over the next four years.

TO PUT THIS IN CONTEXT, \$7.4 BILLION IN MINING ROYALTIES WOULD PAY FOR ALMOST ALL OF THE NSW GOVERNMENT'S \$8 BILLION BUDGET COMMITMENTS FOR BETTER HEALTH FACILITIES ACROSS NSW, INCLUDING THE FUNDING OF 40 NEW

#### AND UPGRADED HOSPITALS ACROSS NSW.

Alternatively, this \$7.4 billion in mining royalties would pay for the bulk of the NSW Government's key Budget commitments on education, including the \$6 billion commitment to fund 170 new and upgraded schools across NSW, and the \$500 million plan to deliver air-conditioning in 1000 schools across NSW.

IT'S A REMINDER OF JUST HOW IMPORTANT MINING IS TO NSW.

It's also a reminder why we need to ensure the benefits from mining reach our local mining



communities. So, it's good to see that Deputy Premier John Barilaro recently announced an additional \$50 million funding round for the Resources for Regions program on top of the previous \$240 million provided through this special fund for mining communities.

We will continue to seek more funding and look forward to more announcements in the future that will help improve quality of life in mining communities.

During our visit, I was given a personal tour of the station's world-class training gallery and virtual reality facility that is delivering stronger outcomes for the industry both in and outside the workplace.

The health and safety of workers should always be the number one priority of everyone in our industry, ensuring workers return home safely at the end of the day. Working closely with industry leaders, the NSW Government has carried out critical reforms to establish a more robust and efficient regulatory framework for industry-wide solutions and standards.

ACCORDING TO THE LATEST NSW MINE SAFETY PERFORMANCE REPORT 2015-16, SAFETY STANDARDS HAVE SHOWN SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT WITH A 14% DECREASE IN THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RECORDABLE INJURIES, DOWN FROM 1,118 TO 959.

It's clear that mining remains a critical driving force behind the NSW economy, delivering growth to our economy, jobs to our communities, and higher standards of living for families throughout the state – and we have the numbers to prove it.

At the end of last year, there were



41 coal mining operations active in NSW with exports rising in value by more than 31% up to \$19.1 billion. According to this year's State Budget, mining royalties are expected to deliver \$7.4 billion in revenue over the next four years. This Budget has committed these returns to delivering essential services that communities across NSW rely on such as schools and hospitals.

NO REGION BETTER EMBODIES THE SUCCESS OF OUR INDUSTRY THAN THE HUNTER WHICH RECEIVED A LION'S SHARE OF \$4.5 BILLION FROM THE \$10.4 BILLION INJECTED INTO THE NSW ECONOMY BETWEEN 2016-2017. THE STATE GOVERNMENT WILL CONTINUE TO BACK PRIVATE BUSINESSES TO INVEST AND CREATE MORE JOBS IN THIS REGION.

#### **AUSTAR'S UNCERTAIN FUTURE**

Yancoal has commenced legal actions against the Resources Regulator after they prohibited all underground longwall mining following recent coal bursts.

Workers will be potentially stood down or redeployed to other Yancoal Hunter sites in the coming weeks whilst the investigation and court proceedings continue.

#### **OVER AND OUT**

Austin Engineering's Muswellbrook facility has ceased operation. The company has promised that the workforce of approximately 100 staff will be paid redundancies in accordance with employee contracts and all long-service and annual leave will be fully paid.

An employee assistance program has been established to assist staff transition to alternative employment and a confidential counselling service will also be provided to those employees who wish to access the service.

#### **EMPLOYEES STRIKE BACK**

Around 250 workers from Mount Pleasant coal mine downed tools for three days after a worker was injured in a rigging accident.

NSW government safety regulators are investigating the incident. Mine owner Mach Energy have confirmed the accident and the resultant three-day strike but said the matter was an issue for the contractor, G&S Engineering.

#### **BHP BATTLES**

BHP is facing two class actions alleging it hired hundreds of mine workers as casual employees to avoid paying proper wages and benefits.

The class actions are being brought on behalf of 800 workers at the Mount Arthur Coal Mine against both BHP and labour hire companies Chandler Macleod and TESA by law firm Adero Law.

#### RIX'S CREEK EXTENSION

Bloomfield Collieries Limited currently has approval to run Rix's Creek Mine, until June next year and are seeking approval to expand the open cut coal mine and extend operations until 2038. It's estimated an extra 25 million tonnes of product coal would be recovered over that period.

#### MINING STUDENTS AT A LOW

There has been an alarming drop in students enrolling in mining engineering at some of Australia's top universities, with only eight graduating as mining engineers from the University of Western Australia in 2018. The University of NSW also received the lowest enrolment level in mining engineering in 40 years, accepting just eight enrolments in 2017.

Youth research agency YouthInsight revealed that low consideration of a career in mining was driven by a lack of knowledge, with 45 per cent of respondents saying, "It's not an industry I've ever thought about" and 40 per cent saying, "I don't know anything about mining."

#### **SOUTH KOREA SULPHUR LIMITS**

South Korea will be setting new limits on sulphur content in coal from July 1 which will potentially impact the Hunter coal industry.

Under the new regulations, Korean power stations will be restricted to burning coal with an average sulphur content of 0.4 per cent or less over a 12-month period.

Although sulphur contents vary from mine to

mine, Australia is internationally acknowledged as low-sulphur. A recent article by research company AME put the Australian average at less than 0.6%.

Although Korea is Newcastle's third-biggest market for thermal power station coal, it only accounts for about 15 per cent of total exports so many in the industry are confident the Korean regulations will have little impact.

#### WILPINJONG MINE CHALLENGE DISMISSED

A legal challenge to Peabody Energy's planned extension of its Wilpinjong thermal coal mine by a local residents group has been dismissed by the state's Land and Environment Court.

"Peabody welcomes the court's decision to uphold the New South Wales government's approval process for the Wilpinjong Extension Project, allowing for the extension of operations until the end of 2031. The decision confirms Wilpinjong can continue to mine in accordance with its granted approvals," a Peabody spokeswoman said.

#### A BLOW FOR HVO

Hunter Valley Operations has received a \$15,000 fine by the New South Wales Environment Protection Authority after a blast from its operations was found to have impacted on the community.

The blast occurred in January and the EPA found they exceeded license limits for air-blast overpressure at two monitoring points, Moses Crossing and Jerry's Plains.

THE NEWCASTLE COAL INFRASTRUCTURE GROUP (NCIG) HAVE BEEN RECOGNISED FOR THEIR OUTSTANDING WORK IN RESTORING WETLAND HABITAT ON ASH ISLAND BY THE PIANC 'WORKING WITH NATURE' AWARDS.

The awards are announced every four years and aim to acknowledge initiatives which promote a proactive, integrated approach to sustainable infrastructure projects. NCIG was awarded a Working with Nature Certificate of Recognition at a recent ceremony in Panama City. Theirs was the first Australian project to be recognised since the establishment of the awards in 2014.

For over 18 months NCIG have been working with many stakeholders to re-establish the endangered coastal saltmarsh ecological community. The tidal wetlands around the Port of Newcastle are home to a number of threatened species and communities. The coastal saltmarsh vegetation community and numerous species of migratory shorebirds, such as the critically endangered Eastern Curlew and Curlew Sandpiper, are increasingly losing habitat along the Australasian-East Asian Flyway.

NCIG CREATED HABITAT FOR MIGRATORY SHOREBIRDS IN AN AREA CLOSE TO THE TERMINAL SITE, SPECIFICALLY ASH ISLAND IN THE HUNTER WETLANDS NATIONAL PARK. THE CONSTRUCTION OF HABITAT ON ASH ISLAND INCLUDED THE RESTORATION OF 24 HECTARES OF MIGRATORY SHOREBIRD HABITAT.

NCIG's CEO, Aaron
Johansen, said the
certificate is testament to
NCIG's commitment to the
environment and the local
Hunter Estuary wetlands.
"The migratory shorebird
habitat restoration project is
unique, in its type and scale

of any conducted within

Australia. NCIG has been

very committed to delivering sustainable environmental outcomes through this project and are very excited to have been recognised for this in an international forum."

Aaron said.

"It's an illustration that the process adopted through integrating stakeholder engagement, cutting edge research and sound environmental practices can achieve tangible outcomes which are considered world's best practice. The great beneficiary of this project however is local wetland communities and the vulnerable and endangered migratory shorebird species which rely on them." Aaron concluded.





## **SECOND CHANCES**

BLACKROCK INDUSTRIES IS UNDERGOING SOME BIG EXPANSIONS, AND ALONG THE WAY MAKING A BIG DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF THOSE YOU WOULD NOT TYPICALLY ASSOCIATE WITH THE MINING INDUSTRY.

The Blackrock Second Chance for Change Program is a rehabilitation program where inmates from St Heliers Correctional Centre come and work for Steve's company on release.

"ONE THING AT BLACKROCK WE BELIEVE IN IS GIVING EVERYONE A SHOT AND AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROGRESS." STEVE SAYS WITH DETERMINATION AND A SMILE. "WE KICKED OFF WITH A HIGH INDIGENOUS EMPLOYMENT RATE AND NOW WHAT WE'RE ACTUALLY TRYING TO DO IS CROSS THAT NEXT SECTOR AND BREAKDOWN BARRIERS WITH PEOPLE WHO AREN'T OFTEN GIVEN SECOND OPPORTUNITIES."

"We kicked off the Blackrock
Second Chance for Change
Program with St Heliers about 2
years ago putting the first two guys
through. They went so fantastic it
enabled us to help more people, so
we have expanded that out to over
17 positions across the company."
"These guys then get everything

from a basic understanding on employment. How to understand safety, how to interact in a mine setting and construction setting, and then hopefully the step will be to progress them through to the mine industry. Giving them these opportunities limits the statistics of reoffending." Steve said.

Mach Energy, Mount Pleasant
Operation General Manager
Richard Bailey, spoke highly of the
initiative. "It has been extremely
positive. There have been no
concerns at all. I think it has been
a real positive concept and has
worked well for all businesses
involved including St Heliers,
Blackrock Industries, and us
here at Mt Pleasant. We are very
supportive of the initiative and
the work Steve has done so far,
and what he is trying to achieve in
this field."


Recently I was approached for help by a widow following the passing of her husband. Though there was a valid will and most of their valuable assets and cash were in joint names, their home was only in the husband's name. Her question was, "Do I need to spend money on obtaining Probate of the Estate?"

THE ANSWER WAS, **UNFORTUNATELY YES. BECAUSE** THE HOUSE WAS IN THE **HUSBANDS NAME THE ONLY WAY** TO HAVE IT TRANSFERRED INTO HER NAME WAS VIA PROBATE OF THE ESTATE. BUT THERE IS A WAY TO AVOID THIS.

There are many reasons homes are purchased in one name even though it is their principle place of residence for a couple. It might be because of tradition, tax reasons or financing requirements. Many couples nearing retirement consolidate their assets and make binding nominations for their Superannuation funds, but they often forget about the family home.

It is relatively inexpensive to convert the title in the family home from individual ownership to a joint tenancy whereby both people own the property. So, when one partner passes, the property does not form part of the estate and instead automatically passes to the surviving partner.

The law provides that where a couple wish to convert the title into a joint tenancy the transaction is exempt from stamp duty. All that is required is a simple statutory declaration confirming



that the parties are in a bona fide relationship and that the property constitutes the principle place of residence of the couple and the payment of filing fees.

HAVING THE FAMILY HOME AS A JOINT TENANCY WILL PROVIDE SECURITY TO THE SURVIVING PARTNER AT A DIFFICULT TIME AND IF THERE ARE NO OTHER **ASSETS THAT REQUIRE PROBATE** IN ORDER TO BE TRANSFERRED, MAY PROVE VERY INEXPENSIVE AS COMPARED TO THE COST OF **OBTAINING PROBATE.** 

If there is a mortgage, then you will require the permission of the mortgagee however usually this is not a problem.

If you find yourself in this situation and would like to consider converting the family home to a joint tenancy take some advice from a solicitor to see if it is worthwhile in your circumstances.

This is general advice and because your individual circumstances will vary I recommend seeking out specific advice for your needs.

THIS YEAR SAW THE REINSTATEMENT OF THE MINES RESCUE CADET PROGRAM AND @ THE COALFACE GOT TO MEET THE LUCKY FOUR CADETS WHO HAVE BEEN GIVEN THIS GREAT OPPORTUNITY.

The Mines Rescue cadet program gives four go getters the opportunity to learn the skills and competencies of a Mines Rescue Training Officer with the objective of gaining industry employment on completion of their two-year cadetship.

The program commenced in 2004 but ceased in 2014 with the downturn in the industry. After talking with this year's cadets, we have no doubt they will all go on to make their mark on our industry.




#### Jackson Lambkin -Hunter Valley Mines Rescue

"It was a big decision to apply for the cadetship as it meant a big pay cut and I had to weigh that against the opportunities that it would create. Jackson said when his cadetship finishes he plans to continue working in the safety side of things. "I love working in mines rescue and I hope to continue to do so when I finish."



After 8 years in the travel industry, Ashlee was looking for a change. "My dad has been part of the coal industry for more than 30 years and I have always been fascinated by it. When this opportunity came up I went for it."

Having just started a Certificate IV in Work Health and Safety at TAFE,

Ashlee will use it and the knowledge and the hands-on skills she's learning at Mines Rescue to further a career in the industry.

As a cadet Ashlee said every day is different. "I love the diversity and the challenge of learning something new every day. I work with an amazing team and the guys here are more than happy to share their vast knowledge." Ashlee was involved in the recent

Coal Services First Aid competition as an assessor and played a casualty at the Newcastle Mines Rescue competition at Newstan. "Both experiences really hit home the importance of the safety training that we provide and how it can be applied in various situations. I would recommend this program for anyone wanting to gain insight into or a foot in the door to the industry."

However you want to look at it, it's not hard to see some kind of viable and valuable military partnership working to benefit a whole lot of people locally, nationally and internationally... soldier on!





David said it all started


when he helped a few people look up some family history. "I was asked to track down some information and so I started talking to people and doing some research. The stories kept growing and growing and before long I had a collection."



#### RACE TO THE RESCUE

BRIGADESMEN FROM ACROSS THE REGION DESCENDED UPON CENTENNIAL COAL'S NEWSTAN COLLIERY ON JUNE 15 TO COMPETE IN THE ANNUAL NEWCASTLE MINES RESCUE COMPETITION AND DEMONSTRATE THEIR SKILLS UNDER PRESSURE.

Brigadesmen from Ashton, Austar, Chain Valley, Integra, Mandalong, Myuna, Newstan, North Wambo and South Blakefield all competed in the competition with Team Orange, led by veteran brigadesman Bob Wilson being declared overall winners of the event.

The day's format included several underground and surface simulation exercises to demonstrate knowledge and the use of equipment in realistic scenarios, including exercises to test hazard awareness, underground search and rescue, first aid and fire-fighting.

"THE NEWCASTLE COMPETITION FORMAT IS UNIQUE AND AS CLOSE TO A REAL-LIFE SCENARIO AS THESE BRIGADESMEN WILL EXPERIENCE. BRIGADESMEN RECEIVE A SIMULATED CALL TO DUTY EARLY IN THE MORNING AND ARE GIVEN INSTRUCTIONS TO ATTEND A PARTICULAR MINE SITE. TEAMS ARE FORMED AS THEY ARRIVE," EXPLAINED DARREN PARKER, ACTING REGIONAL MANAGER NEWCASTLE MINES RESCUE.

'It not only tests their core skills, but also their ability to act and communicate effectively as a team,' he said. Darren went on to explain that teams include seasoned brigadesmen with active duty under their belt, and new brigadesmen competing for the first time.

'The competition is an opportunity to join new trainees with more

experienced brigadesmen to test what they have learnt in their intensive induction program but also to learn from the experience of others,' he said.

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF MINES RESCUE IS TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO THE INDUSTRY IN THE CASE OF AN EMERGENCY. EVENTS LIKE THESE ALLOW THE BRIGADESMEN TO TEST AND HONE THEIR SKILLS IN PREPARATION FOR THE UNFORTUNATE CIRCUMSTANCE WHERE THEY MAY BE CALLED UPON.

General Manager, Mines Rescue and Regulation and Compliance, Matt Fellowes said, 'Thankfully, major incidents requiring brigadesmen response are limited. As an industry we continually strive to create a safer work environment and these volunteer brigadesmen help to support a proactive safety culture onsite. They play a pivotal role in preventing significant incidents from occurring. They, and the mines they represent, can be proud of the skills they have demonstrated.'

The competition is the first in a series of regional competitions hosted by NSW Mines Rescue.
Competitions will also take place in Singleton in July, and Wollongong and Mudgee in August. The winning teams from each region will be invited to compete in the Australian competition to be held in Queensland in October.





huge. The adrenalin was beyond anything I've experienced. I was sitting on pole and I had that much adrenalin that I stuffed the start completely, but anyway we ended up winning that weekend."

"So that's how my Ute career started. That category was one of the toughest things I have ever done, it was such close racing, sometimes there's not even a second apart in the Top 10."

We've got Sydney Motorsport Park which is the undercard for the Supercars, then off to New Zealand." We asked Jeremy what's his career

highlight been so far, and he said without a doubt the Clipsal 500. "It was really special in the V8 Utes coming from a state level racing, stepping onto the big stage. If I was to pinpoint one that would be it. But over the years, even to just to get on the podiums for the Utes is pretty special."

It's been an amazing career for Jeremy so far and we look forward to watching him take out this year's GT4 Championship.




IN THE NINETIES, CATERPILLAR FIRST IDENTIFIED THE NEED FOR LARGER GRADERS FOR MAINTAINING HAUL ROADS USED BY **HEAVY-DUTY HAUL TRUCKS.** 

Having paved the way (excuse the pun) with their 785 (150t), 789 (180t) and 793 (240t) class trucks, they were well progressed in developing their class topping 797 (at the time 327t), when in 1996 they introduced the Cat 24H.

The largest of all H Series graders, this turbo charged machine stood in a class of its own, effectively stamping its authority as the mining machine of choice, when grading haul roads of medium and large

unchallenged, this machine has continued to evolve with the introduction of the 24M in 2007 and most recently the 24, heralding Cat's new generation of products that now exclude the letter modifier that we've all become so used to (a story for another day perhaps).

Thus, if we start with the assumption that this machine incorporates the latest bells and whistles, too broad for the scope of this article, it is perhaps most appropriate, that I focus on the key differences that define this machine from its predecessor.

To begin with, its heavier, gaining an 11% increase in weight, to sport a 'typically equipped' mass of circa 73t.

The addition of these kilos has resulted in greater blade down pressure and increased traction, allowing this machine to maintain a more consistent ground speed, when carrying a larger load on the 7.3m moldboard, working on grade, or turning under load.

Repowered with Cat's C27 ACERT engine, this grader now also has considerably more power than the smaller C18 previously used, resulting in a 15% improvement in low-end torque when compared with the M.

NOT BAD, GIVEN THE **UPSIZING NOW PROLONGS** THE TARGET REBUILD LIFE

OF THE ENGINE BY AN ESTIMATED 33%, THAT WHEN COUPLED WITH A MODULAR APPROACH IN DESIGN, HAS IMPROVED COMPONENT **CHANGEOUTS TIMES BY UP TO 70%,** IN THE CASE OF THE TRANSMISSION AND COOLING PACKAGE.

Unlike the graders of 'yesteryear' (and yes, I realise that was not all that long ago!) that were operated by lever and wheel, today's machines are operated via joystick control. Albeit the early resistance when introduced by Cat in their M Series graders in 2007, this method of operation has achieved widespread acceptance globally.

Interestingly, this technology has led to a 78% reduction in hand and wrist actions, that when paired with Caterpillar's Cat GRADE with Cross Slope systems, has improved operator productivity and haul road quality, resulting in lower truck tire wear, decreasing rolling resistance as well as reducing premature tyre failure; music to all ears, especially the number crunchers that sit in windowless rooms of ivory towers...

PONTOON IN A MONSOON PALE ALE by DEEP CREEK BREWING COMPANY

Made: Auckland, New Zealand Cost: Around \$8 per 440ml can Alcohol: 6.9%... woah!!

Color: Deep Amber

(very unusual for a pale ale).

Nose: Quite mild fruity mixed

hops. Nice.

**Taste:** Initially slightly sweet with complex hops overtones.


**Mouth:** A full bodied ale with plenty of taste. Exactly like it should be.

**Aftertaste:** Awesomely complex hops finish. Tastes kind of sweet

until the 6 second mark when the hops kick in. The bitter finish keeps growing and growing right out to a ripper bitter 15 seconds after a swig.

Comments: Easily the best IPA I've ever reviewed. Takes on all comers worldwide for taste and packs a kick like a mule. Usually increasing a beer's alcohol past 5.3% in the brewing process results in a badly degraded taste. These Kiwi legends have totally nailed it with a full bodied 6.9% Pale that tastes excellent.


But the caves more than made up for the annoying guide. The immensity, the stunning natural architecture and when the lights went out the absolute darkness was like


