For Malabar, world-class mining means world-class rehabilitation. It's a fundamental responsibility they have taken seriously from day one. Within a week of taking control of the site, they commenced rehabilitating the old open cut that they have no use for.

Six months later, the team has made great strides. They currently have around 30 people working on site, who have so far shaped 108 hectares for final rehabilitation and seeded 79 hectares.

REHABILITATION ALSO MEANS BEING ATTENTIVE TO THE THOUGHTS AND PERSPECTIVES OF THE COMMUNITY. TO THAT END. THEY HAVE HAD CONVERSATIONS WITH LOCALS ABOUT THE **DIFFERENT WAYS THE LAND COULD**

They recently hosted community information sessions at the Jerrys Plains School of Arts and Maxwell Infrastructure site near Muswellbrook. These sessions were a great opportunity for them to hear from their neighbours first hand and answer any questions they had about plans for the area.

One use for the land they have settled on is a solar farm. The 'Maxwell Solar Project' is proposed to have an installed capacity of about 25MW and provide 50 more jobs for the local

area during construction. Working at capacity, the solar farm would generate enough energy from the sun to power about 10,000 local homes.

A REFRESHED FORMAT FEATURING INCREASED ENGAGEMENT BETWEEN THE COMMUNITY, BUSINESS AND THE MINING INDUSTRY DREW A RECORD TURNOUT TO THE UPPER HUNTER MINING **DIALOGUE'S ANNUAL FORUM ON NOVEMBER 20.**

With about 150 participants gathering at the Muswellbrook Race Club, the forum featured networking and information sessions where local business people and community representatives could visit more than 30 displays and talk directly to experts on subjects including procurement, rehabilitation, mine regulation, air and water quality and the progress of the review of the Upper Hunter Synoptic Plan.

UPPER HUNTER MINING DIALOGUE CHAIRMAN DAVE O'BRIEN SAID THE FORUM WAS A BIG **SUCCESS WITH NOT ONLY MORE PARTICIPANTS THAN PREVIOUS**

YEARS, BUT ALSO A GREATER **SPREAD OF REPRESENTATION** FROM ACROSS THE UPPER HUNTER **COMMUNITY INCLUDING LOCAL BUSINESS PEOPLE.**

"As part of the refreshed format, this year's forum really focused on offering opportunities for local businesses to interact face to face with mining company procurement personnel," Mr O'Brien said.

"The Dialogue's industry partners provided key personnel from their procurement departments, so people could talk directly to the experts on how the industry and local businesses can do better business together.'

The procurement exhibits were complemented by displays from both Singleton and Muswellbrook business chambers and business development officers from Muswellbrook and Singleton

"THE DISPLAYS OFFERED A VERY VALUABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR **BUSINESS AND THE MINING** INDUSTRY TO CONNECT AND THERE WERE MANY REALLY GOOD AND INTERESTING CONVERSATIONS WHICH WILL BE FURTHER DEVELOPED," MR O'BRIEN SAID.

As well as the focus on business, the forum also featured displays from mining industry rehabilitation and air and water quality experts as well as exhibits from the Department of Primary Industry, Department of Premier and Cabinet, Office of Environment and Heritage, Department of Planning and Environment, NSW **Environment Protection Authority**, NSW Resources Regulator and the University of Newcastle.

Following the networking sessions, participants formed into working groups to recommend solutions to issues as well as how to best take advantage of opportunities raised during the day. Those recommendations will now be reviewed and developed by the Dialogue.

Mining giants BHP Billiton and Peabody Energy have both moved to 30-day payment terms for local businesses.

BHP Billiton said businesses won't need to apply for the new payment terms, they will automatically be moved to 30 days on Dec 1st. Peabody Energy is putting the 30-day payment terms into place as well for all small to medium.

NATIONALS PRESELECTION

The election race is well and truly underway in the Upper Hunter. The National Party held their preselection in mid-November for the state seat re-endorsing Michael Johnsen as the candidate for the March 2019 State Election.

So far for the Upper Hunter seat Country Labor have Martin Rush, the Shooters Fishers and Farmers Party have endorsed Lee Watts and The Greens Party candidate is Tony Lonergan.

Federally, the Nationals also held their preselection for the New England seat. Barnaby Joyce was voted in as the candidate unopposed. The Federal Election is expected to be held on either May 11th or May 18th, 2019.

DROUGHT VISIT

The National Coordinator General for Drought visited the Upper Hunter to listen, plan and act. Major General Stephen Day was appointed to the role in late August to oversee and direct the Federal Government's drought efforts to farmers across the country.

He has been travelling across Australia to drought-affected areas to see first-hand the specific challenges each region faces in what is a devastating and challenging time for many.

"The approach I took was which the Prime Minister agreed to was that I would listen, I would plan and then I would act, and I was pretty fussy about making sure I didn't get that order mucked up," said Major General Day. "It's very tough out there." Major General Day added that the people in the

Upper Hunter "are looking adversity in the eye and they are doing an extremely good job at dealing with it, now I'm not underplaying the challenges out there but I felt very proud to meet these wonderful Australians who are getting on with the challenges and dealing with the drought each day, not always but often with a smile on their face."

BUYING BENGALLA

New Hope Corp Ltd have revealed they are buying a further 10 percent stake in Bengalla mine from Japan's Mitsui & Co Ltd for \$215 million.

The purchase will bring New Hope's interest in Bengalla to 80 percent. The Mitsui transaction comes three months after Wesfarmers Ltd struck a deal to sell its stake in the Bengalla mine to New Hope, which held a 40 percent stake in the mine at the time.

WE LIVE HERE

Two Upper Hunter councils have joined together to kickstart an initiative to help drought-affected businesses.

Muswellbrook Shire Council and the Upper Hunter Shire Council have launched their 'We LIVE Here' cards which will work like an EFTPOS giftcard once they're loaded and will only be able to be used in the two shires, ensuring local expenditure and economic development for the region.

The project is a drought relief initiative giving a helping hand to businesses who are struggling in the devastating drought gripping the region.

Muswellbrook Mayor Martin Rush said, "it's really about keeping money in the local Upper Hunter economy".

COAL COMEBACK

Coal is making a comeback. According to the latest World Energy Outlook (WEO) from the International Energy Agency (IEG), there will be a strong demand for coal in Asia through until 2040.

The WEO estimates the growth in demand for coal in the Asia Pacific will increase by 492 mtce (million tonnes of coal equivalent) by 2040.

Minister for Resources and Northern Queensland Senator Matt Canavan said our coal industry is well placed to meet the demands of Asia while demand drops in other countries.

"These figures show a bright future for Australia's coal industry. They're also a short, sharp shock for those who have set out to destroy confidence in our world-class coal industry. Coal is here and it's here to stay," he said.

WATER SPOT

Hunter Valley Operations has been issued with \$30,000 in penalties by the EPA after the alleged discharge of mine water into Bayswater Creek in May this year.

EPA director Hunter Karen Marler said the discharge was caused by a combination of issues relating to the pumping of mine water without correct procedures being in place to prevent an offsite discharge.

"HVO reported the incident to the EPA as required, undertook actions to respond to the incident, including the removal of the mine water from Bayswater Creek, and has reviewed and improved its operations at the Newdell Load Point Facility," she said



Although, as President of the Singleton Business Chamber, she was already involved with conversations around the growing issues with mining companies and the NSWMC, the real momentum for the formation of the Upper Hunter Mining Dialogue happened in 2010 with public meetings to discuss

"I was there at those original meetings; there was a lot of people, the Singleton Civic Centre was busy. There had started to be pushback regarding mining development. A lot of the issues were environmental such as air and water quality issues, but also traffic was bad, there was no room at hotels and rents were getting very high. Many businesses were getting tired of the issues including the drain on business



employers as their employees migrated to the higher paying mining jobs."

Following the public meetings, the Upper Hunter Mining Dialogue was formed in 2011 and Gill was fully involved from the start - originally as a member of the Social Impacts and Infrastructure Working Group and then as one of three community members of the Dialogue's governing body, the Joint Advisory Steering Committee, when it was formed in October 2015.




And, while not all points of view presented at the Dialogue working groups are agreed upon, Gill says they are treated with respect.

"I thoroughly enjoyed working with the people of the Dialogue," she says. "The different points of view; seeing things from a different perspective. People around the table are very respectful of differing points of view."

And Gill believes the Dialogue continues to serve an important, ongoing purpose. "We didn't set out to solve all the problems of the world, we just chipped away at the biggest issues of the time and made some real progress. "I think it should continue. The projects that are ongoing need to continue. These projects allow the community and the mining companies to come together. There has been so much learning. It's the only way we are going to get consensus and solutions to the issues."




LEARN FROM THE LAWMAN

STUART BARNETT IS OUR MINING INDUSTRY'S LEADING PERSONAL INJURY LAWYER. THIS MONTH HE HAS SOME IMPORTANT ADVICE IN **RELATION TO STAYING SAFE** AND BEHAVIOR OVER THE CHRISTMAS PERIOD.

For many the Christmas party season has already commenced and for others it soon will. Not only will you be partying with family and friends, but you may also potentially be attending work place Christmas functions and work-related events with clients, sponsors and the like. Alcohol is often provided and with that feeling of relaxation sometimes comes errors in judgement.

THINKING ABOUT HOW YOU WILL TRAVEL TO AND FROM EVENTS IS **VERY IMPORTANT. IF YOU DECIDE** TO DRIVE, THEN YOU NEED TO BE **DISCIPLINED ABOUT HOW MUCH** ALCOHOL YOU DRINK. IT IS EASY TO LOSE TRACK OF YOUR DRINKING OVER A PERIOD OF TIME IN A **FESTIVE ATMOSPHERE. YOU DON'T** WANT TO GIVE YOURSELF AN UNEXPECTED CHRISTMAS PRESENT OF NOT HAVING YOUR LICENSE

If you happen to be caught with a blood alcohol reading in the high range of 0.15 or greater then you potentially face maximum fines \$3,300 for a first offence and \$5,500 for a subsequent offence together with maximum prison terms of 18 months for a first offence to 2 years for subsequent offenses. In terms of your license the minimum disqualification is 12 months and to get that you would need to convince the Court to reduce the automatic disqualification of 3 years for your first offence. Your license will also be taken away from you on the spot. THERE IS THEN A GRADED REGIME **OF PENALTIES FOR MID-RANGE** OFFENCES WITH A READING OF 0.08 TO LESS THAN 0.15 AND LOW **RANGE OFFENCES WITH A READING** OF 0.05 TO LESS THAN 0.08. EVEN SO, AT THE BOTTOM END OF THE SCALE THERE ARE PROVISIONS FOR FINES OF UP TO \$2,200 AND **AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION**



OF 6 MONTHS. LEARNERS AND P PLATE DRIVERS CANNOT HAVE ANY ALCOHOL IN THEIR BLOOD WHEN DRIVING

Whilst the criminal penalties for drink driving can have a serious impact upon you and your family, people often forget about other potential penalties. If you hurt someone or worse in an accident could face harsher penalties. If you damage property your comprehensive insurance may be voided by the presence of alcohol, so you could face large claims for damages. You may be injured yourself and not have any insurance coverage, let alone the effect of the loss of your license on your employment.

WHETHER YOU DRIVE OR NOT YOU SHOULD ALSO BE AWARE OF YOUR **BEHAVIOR AT WORK CHRISTMAS** PARTIES OR WORK SPONSORED **EVENTS. NOT ONLY ARE YOU** SUBJECT TO CRIMINAL LAWS, BUT YOUR COMPANY WILL LIKELY HAVE **POLICIES RELATING TO BEHAVIOR** AND BRINGING THE COMPANY INTO **DISREPUTE. SOMETHING DONE** OR SAID UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL MAY HAVE SERIOUS **CONSEQUENCES IN THE LIGHT OF** THE NEXT WORK DAY.

Taking all the above into account please have an enjoyable and safe Christmas and try to refresh over whatever break you are taking.


THE CHRISTMAS TREE FARM


A few days after Christmas, a mother is in the kitchen and hears her young son playing with his new electric train in the next room.

I was born and bred around Muswellbrook. I was incredibly lucky to grow up out of town on land which is now part of the Mt Pleasant project. Great town, great region and great views from home across the valley to the lights of town.

When did you start and what's the ride been like? I started a traineeship with Muswellbrook Coal in 2008 after deciding that being a full time uni student wasn't for me. The team there were great, encouraging me to continue my studies. The ride since then has sped up. MCC is one of the most challenging mining environments going and was a great place to learn the craft and complete my OCE course.

Taking the chance to move up to Maules Creek and be a part of developing a mine from scratch has been incredibly rewarding too – different challenges with more people and moving parts plus a chance to expand my experience – notably achieving my MEM ticket this year.

What's a usual day at There is no such thing as a typical day! Being serious, the first third of my day starts with interacting with

the off going and oncoming supervisory teams and then flows into spending time with them in the field to assist and follow up actions. Next, it's shorter term planning activities then my other main focus is on longer term projects and activities.

How big is the crew? We have around 620 full time roles on site at present, just over 400 in the production side of the world. So we run crews of about 100 at present.

What's the best thing about your job? Two things stand out. Firstly mining satisfies my desire to 'do something' physical. I had a go at a fulltime office role in my first year after high school and found it just wasn't for me. Secondly my role is about leading people to achieve things as a team. I thrive on being part of a high functioning team and my current role gives a lot of opportunity to grow and develop teams and watch them share in welldeserved success.

The worst thing? Moving from shift work to a Monday to Friday role a couple of years ago has given me the opportunity to take on opportunities like my MEM ticket. However this has made it a lot harder to fit in sport and keep my diet and exercise on the right track. It's an excuse I know, but frankly I haven't got the balance adjusted quite right just yet.

What's a funny story about work that you can tell? Let's just say you get some cracking opportunities to take some very

embarrassing photos as part of Mines Rescue training. Or have the photos taken of you.

How different is your job to what you wanted to be when you were a kid? I'm pretty confidant I wanted to drive Thomas the Tank engine as a kid, so I'm part way there by being able to mine the coal Thomas needs.

What would your mum say about you when you were a kid?

Talked too much, dug too many holes (good job experience) and never wanted to sit still and focus on one thing at a time.

Family?

Married my amazing wife Sarah in September this year. No kids yet but a fair amount of two and four leg lawn mowers (cattle & chooks) to keep us busy.

What do you do in your downtime? Sariz does an amazing job of managing our farm (on top of her day job) and she is kind enough to let me help lift heavy things, work with cattle and cut laps in a tractor on my days off.

I'm also privileged to have been elected as a Councillor for Gunnedah Shire two years ago – it's been a really rewarding way to get heavily involved in such a fantastic community and region.

I'm still enjoying playing rugby and can't ever see a future where I don't aim to use most of my annual leave on snow skiing which are both great ways to unwind and switch the brain off from work.



I encourage men to go along to your doctors for a checkup now, rather than when it's too late. I can't thank the Health Bus enough."

The kids were kept well entertained too with free face painting, a jumping castle and an artificial mine in the form of a sand pit, where the kids had a heap of fun using equipment to dig coal out themselves.

Refereeing is a rewarding role, but unfortunately even though the stigma that was once attached to it has lessened, the hardworking guys and girls still often don't receive the respect they deserve.



Other things of interest around the bay have been Flathead smashing lures in just about any shallow area in the bay and Jewfish continue to be plentiful in the holes behind Middle Island with squid baits proving to be deadly.

THE LAKE

Very similar story to the bay with plenty of Flathead and School Jew to be caught throughout the lake. The biggest difference in the lake is the Arrow Squid numbers are starting to improve and well worth bouncing a few jigs. While waiting for the Witches hats, soak for either Blue swimmers or a Mud crabs as you never know where your likely to come across a muddy in the lake.

BEACHES

It's definitely Whiting time of year with great numbers starting to show up. A few solid Bream in the mix along all our local beaches with the standout being Birubi end of Stockton beach, chewing on beach worms and Pippies.




