FOLLOWING THE RECENT STATE ELECTION, IT'S GREAT THAT CANDIDATES SUPPORTIVE OF THE LOCAL MINING INDUSTRY WERE RE-ELECTED TO PARLIAMENT.

Congratulations to the re-elected Member for Upper Hunter Michael Johnsen for retaining his marginal seat in what was a tough election. Michael has been a strong advocate for miners and their families over many years. It's also important to acknowledge the strong support our industry received from other candidates including Labor's Melanie Dagg and Lee Watts from the Shooters, Fishers and Farmers Party.

It was also satisfying to that the Greens candidate for Upper Hunter saw his vote drop. The Greens campaigned on a platform of shutting down the local coal sector within ten years, and the voters gave this policy the treatment it deserved.

Across most of regional NSW the Green vote went backwards. In

other Hunter mining seats like
Cessnock and Maitland the Greens
and their allies also campaigned
hard against coal mining - and
went backwards. In these seats the
Greens policy to shut down coal
mining within ten years was also
rejected by those who would be
most affected, including 12,000 coal
miners and their families.

Overall the Greens statewide vote fell to 9.4 percent - their worst result since 2007. While they held their existing three seats, they lost support across most of the rest of NSW.

The collapse of the Greens vote across NSW and the rejection of the Greens' radical policy agenda sends a pretty clear message.

Voters want economic responsibility and support for the industries



that deliver jobs, investment and growth, particularly in regions like the Hunter. Hopefully we can get right policies here in NSW that support mining in creating more jobs, particularly in regions that contribute so much to our State, like the Hunter.

PUSH FOR POWER PLANT

The China Energy Engineering Corporation (CEEC) announced to the HONG KONG stock exchange they they're looking to fund the build of two 1000-megawatt ultra-supercritical coal-fired power plants in the Hunter Economic Zone near Kurri Kurri.

The power plant would more than replace the energy shortfall they could be left when AGL's Liddell coal fired power station at Muswellbrook closes its doors in 2022.

"The plant will be based around ultra-supercritical pulverised coal (PC) fired technology. In recent years, Ultra-supercritical (USC) technology has become mandatory in ensuring reliable CO 2 emission reduction and considerably."

The NSW Department of Planning is yet to receive any formal applications for the project.

CARNAGE CRIM CONVICTED

Rodney Johnson has been sentenced to a maximum 12 years behind bars after the carnage he caused in Singleton in 2017 when he stole a truck from Murrurundi and led police on a pursuit to Singleton.

The pursuit ended when the truck ploughed into several cars and a building on the New England Highway and erupted in a fireball.

The court heard Rodney Johnson stopped taking psychiatric medication two months prior to the incident and was suffering from hallucinations. He also hadn't slept in the four days leading up to the incident.

Johnson will be eligible for parole in 2024 once he has completed 6 years and 6 months of his prison sentence.



The Coalition is pushing to get legislation through that would see casual mine workers have the right to be converted to permanent employment.

Federal Minister for Resources and Northern Australia Matt Canavan has been urging the Labor Party to back the changes they want to make contained in the federal Coalition's Fair Work Amendment (Right to Request Casual Conversion) Bill 2019.

Minister Canavan said that, under the new legislation, all employees in the national system will have access to a minimum standard of a right to request casual conversion which cannot be traded away, irrespective of whether their terms and conditions of employment are set by a modern award, enterprise agreement or any other arrangements.

Hunter MP Joel Fitzgibbon argued that in fact the Coalition's plan only gives workers the 'right to request' but not the 'right to receive' permanent positions of employment. He said that Labor has had a policy in place since 2016 to address the casualisation of the workforce.

The CFMEU back NSW Labor's 3-point plan for mine workers to address casualisation which was also backed up by Federal Labor's plan.

FINE FOR MINE

A Muswellbrook mine has been hit with a fine from the NSW Environment Protection Authority after mine water got into a local creek.

The NSW EPA fined Maxwell Ventures \$15,000 for the incident where mine water discharged from Malabar Coal Mine to Saltwater Creek due to an overflow from a dam on site.

"An estimated 6 megalitres of mine water with high levels of salt and sulphate entered the creek after too much mine water was allegedly transferred to the dam resulting in the overflow," Hunter NSW EPA Director Karen Marler.

The NSW EPA said that Maxwell Ventures have indicated they have made procedural changes to operations to ensure further incidents such as this do not occur in future.

JOHNSEN TAKES TOP SPOT

Country Labor candidate Melanie Dagg conceded defeat to the National Party's Michael Johnsen in the race for the Upper Hunter in the NSW Election.

"Country Labor is proud of the fact that we ran a positive campaign focused on improving our hospitals, schools and infrastructure, protecting our water, and standing up for the pay and working conditions of our mining workers," said Country Labor candidate Melanie Dagg.

"Our commitment to deliver for the people of the Upper Hunter continues, and I will be working hard every day to hold this government to account," she

It has been another close race in the Upper Hunter seat with a just over 4% difference between the two major parties with now just over 80 per cent of the vote counted.

"I congratulate Melanie on her efforts and wish her and her family well for the future. I am extremely humbled and am honoured to represent the wonderful people of our Upper Hunter communities in the NSW Parliament," said Michael Johnsen.

DOLLARS FOR DROUGHT

Upper Hunter Shire Council received a \$738,000 funding injection from the Federal Government's Drought Communities Program (DCP) that targets infrastructure, stimulating local expenditure and strong communities.

Merriwa Tennis Courts will be upgraded with courts to be resurfaced and one adapted for multi-purpose sporting use, White Park will get a new canteen and office, Bill Rose Sports Complex will receive a new irrigation system, Aberdeen will receive an adventure playground at Jefferson Park and there will be water filling stations installed at Scone and Merriwa.

CONSTRUCTION SITE TO CAUSE **DETOURS**

Muswellbrook Shire Council is undertaking work on Thomas Mitchell Drive in the vicinity of Blakefield Road through contractor KCE Pty Ltd who are undertaking works that include earthworks, stormwater, pavement and road sealing works.

Construction is expected to take approximately 16 weeks to complete. Works will be conducted between the hours of 7.00am-6.00pm Monday to Friday and 8.00am-1.00pm Saturday.

During some of the construction stages access to Thomas Mitchell Drive from Blakefield Road will be restricted with detours in place via Wallarah Road and Carramere Road, Access to Blakefield Road from Thomas Mitchell Drive will be maintained.

POLITICIANS LOW ON EGO BUT HIGH ON ENTHUSIASM FOR WHAT THEY DO ARE HARD TO COME BY. AFTER SITTING DOWN OVER A CHICKEN SCHNITTY AND A GOLD WITH FEDERAL MINISTER FOR RESOURCES MATT CANAVAN I'M CONVINCED HE'S ONE OF THE GOOD ONES.

From the get-go there wasn't too much of the typical pollie line. It was just a relaxed chat free of minders and advisors about our mining industry, but more importantly his love for our mining communities and people. You see Matt might be at the big end of politics at Federal level, but at heart he is clearly a proud local bloke from Rockhampton in regional Queensland. Like many of us he is juggling a pretty demanding job and a young family.

Matt made it very clear that he believes in creating vibrant communities through mining, and in our area that means coal.

HE WAS STRAIGHT UP ON THAT POINT, "THE REASON I SUPPORT THE COAL INDUSTRY SO PASSIONATELY IS NOT BECAUSE OF ROYALTIES, IT'S BECAUSE OF THE OPPORTUNITIES IT PROVIDES TO INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR FAMILIES TO CREATE COMMUNITIES AROUND MINING ACTIVITY. THE HUNTER AND NORTHWEST ARE GREAT EXAMPLES OF THAT I CAN TELL YOU. OF COURSE, THE ROYALTIES DO A LOT OF GOOD AND HELP SOCIETY IN GENERAL AS WELL."

Matt talked about the need for a diverse range of employment opportunities to be provided regionally and how mining can help there. Not just on mines but in the towns as well.

Matt pushed the point even further, "These days it's important to provide a mix of opportunities because both parents need to work and providing mine industry office jobs in town helps businesses like cafes and retail thrive through more support. We need to see more of that. That in-turn provides even greater opportunities for the extended family and more broadly the community that don't have mining jobs. It means more teachers in schools and that kind of thing. It all really helps to attract families for the long term and not just individuals satisfying a short-term contract need."

Matt was also keen to talk local indigenous employment, "One thing I really love to see is the great innovative mining businesses here in The Hunter. The region is real centre of excellence. Companies like Blackrock Industries and what they are doing for indigenous employment is a great example. They have 75% indigenous employment which

is quite remarkable. It's a great unknown fact that indigenous employment in mining has grown at 2.5 times the rate of industry in general. And that has meant that a higher proportion of aboriginals are employed by the mining sector than any other sector of industry in the country. It's something we should be proud of and I commend Blackrock for being at the forefront of that."

He was also pretty strong on not being a big fan of FIFO though he does believe it has a place in the industry as some mines are just too remote to do anything but. Ideally, we should create great regional communities around mines with potential for broader prosperity. Here @ The Coalface we couldn't agree more.

On challenges around conflicting land uses and getting that right, it is important all around the country as it is here in the Hunter.

"THE HUNTER AND NORTH
WEST AND WHERE I'M FROM IN
THE BOWEN BASIN ARE LIVING
EXAMPLES OF HOW THAT
CAN WORK AND HOW OTHER
INDUSTRIES CAN THRIVE," MATT
TOLD US.

"In both areas agriculture is of massive importance economically and culturally. So is mining. Even with some inevitable challenges, working through them and working together can and does bring great

results for both industries and the communities they support. We can do this well and we have done this well. There is no reason we can't do it even better into the future providing it's done in a sensible and balanced way. We can always improve and we should always try to," said Matt.

"People say we should shut down Australian coal, well that will do nothing to stop coal use around the world it will actually be worse because people will switch to a poorer quality product. Being a Queenslander, I don't think NSW beats Queensland in too many things, but you do have better thermal coal than us. It's the best in the world and the Hunter Valley in my view is at the core of helping the world reduce its carbon emissions."

Matt was very clear about the fact we are not going to reduce use to zero or anywhere near it anytime soon. In fact, he told us that even if you take the conservative predictions of the International Energy Agency, we are going to mine more coal in the first 40 years of this century than we ever have in history before. That's just a function of the size of Asia and the amount

of coal fired power stations and how they will be used for decades to come.

Matt believes on a range of fronts more Australian coal will equal better environmental outcomes. If you take carbon emissions and our higher calorific energy coal, we have the best in the world and it's barely matched anywhere in the world. The more we can use that than say Indonesian coal or Indian coal, which is much worse from an energy perspective, then the better it will be. We can basically generate more electricity for less carbon.

WE HAVE GOT TO KEEP EXPORTING.

"We are the world's largest exporter of coal but we are actually only 5% of world production. Even if coal use were to decline in global sense; given the quality of our coal from both an energy content perspective and also in terms of ash and other impurities, our coal will continue to be mined because there is going to be an increase in demand as we have seen recently for high quality coal. In the last couple of years, the premium for our product has grown about nine times as countries demand and are willing to pay for a superior product. As long as Asia wants to grow and develop, they will be willing to pay for ours and that will underpin support for our industry for generations to come. Matt has just completed the first National Resources Statement in twenty years and one of the big

parts of that is driving the industry to continue to improve in areas as mentioned and rehabilitation in particular as well.

On that Matt was keen for the last word, "I think we lead the world in this, and we have a lot that we can teach the world on it as well. But we can always get better ourselves too and it's got to be at the core of what the mining industry does. We have to leave a legacy of employment and community opportunity and great land and farming opportunities where they used to mine."

Well said mate, we hope you're leading the charge for quite a while yet.



The visit saw Chris travel to pit bottom and to the coalface, roughly six and a half kilometres below the ground and 120 metres below the depths of Lake Macquarie. During his 45-minute journey, Chris passed through a series of tunnels and passageways

surrounded by pitch black

and it was certainly an eye

darkness. Most of us have no

idea what it's like underground

"The trip down here was like nothing else I've ever experienced before. I didn't really know what to expect but I have to say I was amazed, especially when we got to the coalface," Chris said. "It's a different world."

During his journey Chris took the time to speak to some of the people involved in the mine to hear firsthand just what it's like to work in an underground coal mine.

"ALONG THE WAY I GOT TO SPEAK TO SOME OF THE MEN WHOSE WORKING LIVES ARE SPENT UNDERGROUND. THIS IS WHY OUR LIGHTS ARE ON. BECAUSE OF THE HARD WORK AND INGENUITY THAT GOES ON UNDERGROUND IN PLACES LIKE THIS MINE," CHRIS SAID.

He also spoke with Mine Manager John Turner. John was only to happy to share the history of Myuna and talk about the mine's operations.

"We are proud of what we do, and we like to show it off to the community," John said.

As part of its educational program, the Dialogue aims to work with schools to allow students who are not located within travelling distance to mines to "visit" mine sites through the VR experience.



Crews from Bloomfield Open Cut, Rix's Creek Mine, Four Mile and Kings Engineering joined with the many retirees from The Bloomfield Group who'd spent countless hours on the P&H 5700.

Transported from the Port of Newcastle and assembled by Bloomfield employees in 1981, the P&H 5700 Shovel was one of only a handful ever made.

THE MIGHTY SHOVEL IS A MONSTER WITH ITS 60-CUBIC-YARD DIPPER, 70-FOOT BOOM AND 1,838 TONWORKING WEIGHT.

It was the last of its kind in operation, and until late last year it was a pillar of Bloomfield's operations. The P&H 5700 Face Shovel has been replaced with a Hitachi EX 5500 Hydraulic Excavator.

As well as launching its new company values focused on care and delivery, Bloomfield recently redefined its company vision to state the importance of respecting their proud history as they shape their future.



Greg spent almost a decade at Caterpillar before moving on to work for O&K in Western Australia. He has also spent time working for other key industry players including Liebherr and Emeco. During this time, he gained a broad understanding of how these organisations think and function as he worked his way up.

"For me the best part of the job is the people and the best part of being the CEO is being in a position to enable the success of those people and support them," Greg says.




Most people are aware that if you get injured at work that you have a right to claim workers compensation. What you may not be aware is that as a Coal Miner you are also entitled to Workers Compensation if you are injured on a journey from your usual place of abode to work or from your place of work to your usual place of abode. This is often referred to as a "Journey Claim".

THE RIGHT TO CLAIM WORKERS
COMPENSATION FOR INJURIES
RECEIVED ON A JOURNEY TO
OR FROM WORK IS, GENERALLY
SPEAKING, ONLY AVAILABLE TO
PERSONS EMPLOYED IN OR ABOUT
A COAL MINE. FOR THOSE NOT SO
EMPLOYED, SUCH CLAIMS MAY NOT
BE AVAILABLE BUT, IF YOU ARE IN
DOUBT PLEASE TAKE SPECIFIC LEGAL
ADVICE ON THE ISSUE.

Your journey begins at the boundary of the land on which your place of abode is situated. That means that you are not covered if you are injured walking from your back door to your garage for example, where the back door and garage are within the boundaries of your land. The most common journey claims relate to persons injured in motor vehicle or bike accidents on the way to or from work.

THERE ARE EXCEPTIONS TO THE RIGHT TO CLAIM COMPENSATION FOR AN INJURY INCURRED ON A JOURNEY TO OR FROM WORK.

For example, where you take a detour that materially increases your risk of injury or where there is a substantial break in the journey. Your own fault in


causing a motor accident can also be a factor especially if alcohol or drugs are a factor.

A Journey claim should not be confused with an injury that you suffer during the course of your employment. If for example you arrive at work and are required to drive a car or a truck as part of your work and are injured, then you are regarded as being at work and the normal workers compensation rights apply.

ONCE YOU HAVE SATISFIED THE REQUIREMENTS OF A JOURNEY CLAIM THEN ALL OF THE NORMAL WORKERS COMPENSATION RIGHTS THAT ARE OTHERWISE AVAILABLE APPLY.

You should also remember that if you are injured in a motor vehicle accident that you may have concurrent rights to claim compensation under the Motor Accidents Act, sometimes called a third-party claim. In those circumstances you should take advice as time limits and other considerations come into play.





Those were words spoken by Rear-Admiral Byrd on March 14, 1939 when he declared his next trip to Antarctica would have far greater results than any venture since the settlement of America. So, it got us thinking, was Byrd correct, or was he talking crazy?


Byrd was not the first to discover coal in the chilliest part of the world. The first indication of the possible existence of coal in Antarctica was on the first Scott Expedition of 1901 to 1904 when the expedition geologist Hartley Ferrar recorded the presence of carbonaceous material in Victoria Land. Then during the British Antarctic ("Nimrod") Expedition of 1907 to 1909, coal was first discovered by Frank Wild near the Beardmore Glacier.

WE NOW KNOW THAT COAL IS ONE OF THE MAIN MINERAL RESOURCES ON THE CONTINENT, WITH COAL **ACROSS MANY PARTS OF THE** TRANSANTARCTIC MOUNTAINS AND PRINCE CHARLES MOUNTAINS.

However, all indications show that the coal is low quality with a high moisture and ash content. Far better reserves are found elsewhere on earth and are far more readily developed.

Because coal mining in Antarctica would be difficult, dangerous and expensive. Most of the continent is completely covered in snow and ice, usually hundreds or even thousands of meters thick making drilling extremely difficult. The icebergs that drift around the continent frequently grind into the ocean floor and also make locating deposits even harder. Add to that the location. Antarctica is one of the remotest places on earth making the transportation of coal and equipment in and out expensive and

But even if you could overcome all these obstacles, mining in Antarctica is prohibited under Article 7 of the Protocol on Environmental Protections to the Antarctic Treaty. So technically, Admiral Byrd was correct and there probably is enough coal to power the needs of the world during his time. But he was also crazy to think that they would be able to extract and transport the coal with the technology they had

On the scale of commitment, our research shows that they have invested more than \$85 million since 2006 across NSW and Queensland. During 2018, they directly contributed approximately \$4.7 million to more than 30 community projects and partnerships in a wide range of areas including health, education, environment and local need. There is more off the record we know about as well. The thing about this commitment is that it is all voluntary and over and above regulatory requirements.

On the night we heard first hand from some truly passionate people and how they are using their support to do truly amazing work. Tim Faulkner from Aussie Ark is a joy to watch and a conservation hero up there with Steve Irwin. Then

there was Leonie Hansen from Central Queensland Rescue Helicopter who lives and breathes their important work.

For me though, it was Pauline Carrigan from The Where There is a Will Foundation. Their program delivers a Positive Education approach to education that blends academic learning with character and wellbeing. Preparing students with life skills such as: grit, optimism, resilience, growth mindset, engagement and mindfulness amongst others. The Foundation is inspired by the loss of her son Will to suicide. Pauline is doing amazing things and declared the partnership has been instrumental in making a difference. This amazing woman summed up the importance of the support almost bringing the room to tears;



BACK AND NECK PAIN ARE UNDOUBTABLY THE HIGHEST PREVALENT INIURIES CONTRIBUTING TO LTI'S IN THE MINING INDUSTRY. WHY DOES THIS HAPPEN AND WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT?

Every week our clinic sees a few workers presenting with acute jarred necks or backs. With optimal early Physio intervention, the vast majority of these episodes will settle within a few weeks, however there are some injures which are more severe with a protracted course of recovery as well as those that are chronic recurrent type episodes. Then there are the workers who experience regular "soreness and stiffness" about their backs (lower back pain-LBP) and necks related to their work.

THE BAD NEWS: SITTING MAKES YOU **WEAK, STIFF AND FAT...**

The main contributors to back and neck pain are vibration and jarring, previous injury and prolonged sitting, Prolonged sitting causes a relative deconditioning of the muscles about the spine. As we sit relatively still, the muscles are only active at a very low level and become fatigued and relatively weak.

THE GOOD NEWS: WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT IT: ...GET STRONG, SUPPLE AND FIT!

Move as much as possible. Get out of the seat whenever the opportunity arises at work, short breaks even for

a minute or so help to reduce stiffness. Perform some gentle exercises when you stand up to reverse your posture. Walk around during work when you can and on your days off as walking brings many health benefits.

GET SAFE

Operate safely. Consider driving conditions

accordingly and take care not to drive too quickly over rough terrain. How you drive makes a big difference to those impact shocks.

GET POSTURE

Practice re-setting your posture regularly, this will help your spinal muscle endurance.

GET RECOVERED

Use exercises and fitness. Just like sports people consider recovery exercise on your days off. e.g. pool work is fantastic for this. A nice remedial massage can also be useful to relieve some of those knots if you've had a rough week. Optimal sleep and nutrition also helps recovery processes.

GET STRONGER

Counter the deconditioning by the protective effects of appropriate strengthening. Home core exercises are great or there are other ways of staying strong including the gym - make sure that you have suitable supervision though.

GET HELP

If you have ongoing problems and pain. See the Physio for some professional support. Check out our Get Back quantified back and







Often placed in news articles and on vendor websites, the photos of these trucks are readily available and cheap to buy for use in media. Instantly recognisable in their bright yellow, white and Royal Blue, these trucks are stunningly ugly and are as unattractive, as Caterpillar is sexy.

A product of Zhodzina, Belarus, their 'industrial' design is typical of many machines that come from the old Eastern Bloc countries. Robust, relatively reliable and cost competitive, they are popular in



many countries with solutions ranging in size from 30 mt through to their 450 mt behemoth the 75710. Since opening in 1948, they have produced over 120,000 vehicles for use in the Soviet Union.

INTRODUCED TO THE WORLD IN SEPTEMBER 2013, THE WORLD'S LARGEST, HIGHEST PAYLOAD **CAPACITY HAUL TRUCK IS THE BELAZ 75710.**

Big and bulky, it has a conventional two-axle setup but twice as many wheels (four to each axle) as standard trucks, allowing it to carry a whopping 450 metric tonnes (mt). To enable it to carry such a load, it has four-wheel drive, four-wheel hydraulic steering and (given its sheer size) a wide turning circle of about 20 metres.

Over 20 metres long and nine metres tall, it weighs in at 360 mt, the equivalent of more than 200 cars. Powered by two MTU 16V4000 engines, it pumps out 4,600 hp to its Siemens AC drive system and can go

up to 64kph. Unlike the array of tray options available to most ultra-class haulers, this truck has a relatively shallow bed limiting the volume of material that can be carried and applications it can be applied. As ugly as it is, the Belarusians

must be congratulated for their innovation and determination to go BIG. Manufactured to ISO9000 standards this truck is in effect a manufacturing marvel that operates in some of the world's harshest and most desolate operating conditions.





When you think of South Africa, commonly you think of safaris, exotic animals and beautiful landscapes. I am happy to confirm that this magnificent region encompasses all those experiences and so much more.

I decided the most authentic way to experience South African culture would be to volunteer through a remote community organisation. VESA is an organisation that provides direct support to communities that are in parts of the world normally overlooked by larger non-for-profit organisations.

As an impulsive 18-year-old travelling alone to a foreign country, I was understandably crapping myself. I was relieved to be meeting a group of volunteers over there, a great option for the solo traveller.

UPON ARRIVING AT THE KING SHAKA
INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IN DURBAN, I WAS
IMMEDIATELY WELCOMED BY A SEA OF LOCALS
EXCITED TO PLACE A NECKLACE OF FLOWERS OVER
MY HEAD. THIS WELCOMING GIFT, ALONG WITH
THE BEAUTIFUL CHORUS OF LOCAL SONG FILLING
THE AIR, MADE ME FEEL AT HOME.

As a volunteer, you do rough it a bit when it comes to travel and accommodation. This was evident on the 3-hour airport transfer in a non-air-conditioned bus that I endured on a 30-degree scorcher of a day.

The onsite bar and cheap shots made up for the 2-star shared accommodation which glamorously featured single bunk beds and doors that didn't lock.

It's a completely different way of life over there. There are around 30 languages spoken in South Africa with a unique mix of cultures bursting with energy and colour.

Getting to know the locals is by far one of the best parts. I met a large group of local orphans cared for by a lady who they know best as Mama. Mama has

dedicated her life, and her small one-bedroom hut, to housing and caring for the local children who have lost their parents and families. We spent the next month building a new orphanage and playground for the kids, teaching them nursery rhymes and seeing their smiling faces each day.

THINK YOU'RE KING OF THE JUNGLE? YOU WON'T BE LAUGHING WITH THE LIONS WHEN YOU GET UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL ON SAFARI. IF YOU LOVE WILDLIFE, THERE'S PLENTY TO SEE.

During the trip, I saw every member of the 'Big Five' including lions, zebras, hippos, vultures and monkeys running around the streets trying to steal food. I lost an orange out of my hand more than once.



I was told numerous times to watch out for

wild hippos and climb the nearest tree if they come running at you, but don't let this deter you from a river boat experience to cruise with the hippos and crocodiles or discover your wild side and whitewater raft down the rapids.

And it's not just the interior that's worth seeing. The coast surrounding South Africa features serene, crystal clear ocean. The picturesque islands located just offshore make for a great day trip. Diving with whale sharks was my personal favourite activity, although diving into the ocean and seeing the size of them did cause me to hyperventilate and forget how to swim (hot tip: don't forget how to swim).

The unique mix of volunteering with the local children and families, followed by a jam-packed week of adventure and activity, results in a great trip. Try something new and book a volunteer trip, it's eye-opening.
