



STRIKE FORCE CRACK DOWN ON COAL

Local police were forced to form a Strike Force in a bid to crack down on protesters disrupting coal movements in the Hunter Valley.

There were more than 20 people arrested over the course of nearly two weeks for climbing on coal wagons, chaining themselves to railway lines and stopping work at Kooragang Island.

One climate activist who stopped a coal train for five hours has been sentenced to 12 months in jail.

EPA DISHES OUT BIGGEST FINE THEY CAN TO

AGL has copped a fine from the NSW Environment Protection Authority after their Liddell Power Station exceeded its permitted emissions.

The EPA said the exceedances were allegedly caused by a small number of failures of bags in the baghouse, which are designed to filter out very small solid particles and those failures were not detected by the continuous monitoring system.

The EPA has issued AGL with a \$15,000 Penalty Notice for allegedly contravening its Environment Protection Licence under the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 – it's the largest fine the EPA can issue.

EMISSION REDUCTION PLAN FOR KOORAGANG

One of NSW's biggest industrial sites, Kooragang Island, has received a huge grant to install an emission reduction system.

Through the NSW Government's Net Zero Industry and Innovation Program, site owner Orica has received \$13 million for a Decarbonisation Project, an emissions reduction system which will reduce almost half the emissions that come from the site. The project is expected to start in August 2022 and will take three months to complete.

HYDROGEN HUB FOR NEWCASTLE

The Federal Government is investing in a potential hydrogen hub in Newcastle. Prime Minister Scott Morrison paid the Hunter a visit to announce a \$1.5 million grant towards a \$3 million feasibility study for a hydrogen hub at the Port of Newcastle.

The other \$1.5 million will be put forward by the project partner Macquarie Group's Green Investment Group.

The study will consider the best location in the Port for hydrogen infrastructure, with Newcastle having great potential both as a local energy provider and exporter of clean hydrogen.

The Government is investing more than \$1.2 billion to accelerate the development of an Australian hydrogen industry, including \$464 million to develop up to seven Clean Hydrogen Industrial Hubs in regional Australia.

FAIR WORK HEARS MINE WORKERS PLEA

The Fair Work Commission held two days of hearings into a vaccine mandate at a Hunter Valley mine.

The mining arm of the CFMEU took workers' fight over a COVID-19 vaccine mandate at BHP's Mount Arthur mine at Muswellbrook to Fair Work saying it was "unfair".

Mine workers were told they had to have had the first dose of a vaccine by November 10 and the second by the end of January or face being stood down without pay.

About 50 workers are going to be impacted if the mandate isn't changed.

BHP did release a statement to say they had researched the issue thoroughly and believed it was the best decision moving forward to protect their workers, their families and the communities they mine in.

GLENCORE ON THE GROUND AT MOUNT OWEN

Glencore has announced they plan to take over the running of their Mt Owen mine near Singleton on the ground.

The mine is owned by the mining giant but was run by contractor Theiss. Glencore has announced they won't renew Theiss' contract after December next year and Glencore will take over the day-to-day running of the mine.

That move will provide ongoing work for staff at the Glendell mine with it's life scheduled to wind down in 2023 if an extension to operations doesn't get approved - those workers would move over to Mt Owen.

The CFMEU says they are in talks with both Glencore and Theiss to make sure workers get a fair go.

GOVERNMENT NOT BYPASSING COMMUNITY FOR COMMENT

Locals can now comment on revised plans for the Muswellbrook Bypass project.

The design unveiled last month includes five bridges and features a 367 metre long bridge spanning Sandy Creek Road, Sandy Creek and the Main North railway line plus adjustments to local roads.

Construction is expected to start on the project in late-2022 and you can comment on the plans online, via email, post or by calling the project hotline. Details: https://nswroads.work/muswellbrook

MILLIONS DELIVERED THROUGH **RESOURCES TO REGIONS**

More than 20 projects in the Upper Hunter are benefitting from the eighth round of Resources for Regions from the NSW Government.

Some projects include nearly \$6.4 million is going to the Muswellbrook Regional Entertainment and Conference Centre project, \$1.199 million towards Singleton Council's Mining Roads Upgrade Program, and \$434,244 to assist Upper Hunter Shire Council to improve Muffett Street providing upgraded access to the Scone Industrial area, saleyards, etc.

AJ DISAPPEARANCE SIMPLY MISADVENTURE

Hunter Valley police have concluded their investigation into the three-day disappearance of AJ Elfalak as "misadventure".

In September 3-year-old AJ was reported missing to police after he disappeared from the family's property at Putty near Singleton

Hundreds of emergency services and volunteers combed through the bushland surrounding the home for three days before AJ was found drinking water from a creek by PolAir, only about 200-metres from the family's home as the crow flies.

Miraculously he was unhurt.

NSW Police released a statement this morning to say the investigations Hunter Valley Police District officers were conducting were now complete.

"That investigation has now concluded, and the incident has been determined to be as a result of misadventure."



TOWARDS DECARBONISATION

THIS MONTH WE CAUGHT UP WITH MARK MCCALLUM, CEO OF LOW EMISSION TECHNOLOGY AUSTRALIA (LETA) TO FIND OUT WHAT'S NEW IN THE WORLD OF CARBON CAPTURE UTILISATION AND STORAGE (CCUS).

It's been a couple of years since we delved into the technologies of CCUS and since then there's been plenty of exciting new developments. While CCUS is a proven technology that is already working in more than 25 countries around the world, Mark explained how the exponential growth of the technology is continually opening up new avenues to explore.

"These past 18 months we have been expanding our scope of interest and investing in projects that can reduce and remove emissions not just from power generation, but across a broad range of hard-to-abate industries such as steel, cement, petrochemical and feritiliser production," Mark shared.

Decarbonising these sectors which we heavily rely on for everyday products through carbon capture and storage is something Australia has an enormous potential for. You only have to look at Glencore's CTSCo project in the Surat basin. This one site alone has the potential to store over 500 million tonnes of CO2, possibly even double that. It's a great example of how we are beginning to unlock the potential of storage options in Australia and Mark says it's only the beginning.

"We are looking at different suitable storage locations across Australia and here in NSW we are working with the Coal Innovation team to find sites with the right characteristics. The more storage options we have, the more opportunities we have to reach the end goal of decarbonisation. We have also been focusing on increasing people's understanding of storage, so they can be confident that when CO2 is stored it will safely stay where it's put."

WHILE THE POSSIBILITIES OF STORAGE IN AUSTRALIA ARE ENORMOUS. WHAT'S **GOT MARK EXCITED IS THE INNOVATIVE TECHNOLOGIES THAT ARE COMING INTO** PLAY THAT ARE GIVING US THE ABILITY TO **GENERATE BRAND NEW FORMS OF ENERGY AND NEW CLEAN INDUSTRIES.**

"CCUS can also be used to produce clean fuels of the future, like hydrogen and ammonia, and help establish Australia as a world-leading clean energy exporter," explained Mark.

"One of the new technologies that is a potential game changer is zero-emission Allam-Fetvedt Cycle technology. The Allam-Fetvedt Cycle is a new type of power cycle that converts

gaseous fuels into thermal energy, while capturing the generated CO2. Which simply put, means generating low cost power without producing air emissions."

LETA is involved in funding two major projects using the Allam Cycle technology. The first is the Zero Emission Syngas Combustor Test which is co-funded by the US Department of Energy and is exploring the adaptation of Allam Cycle technology from natural gas to coal. The second is a feasibility study to assess the viability of developing Allam Cycle projects from black coal in Australia.

Together, the Allam Cycle projects aim to prove that competitive, zero-emission industries like hydrogen and fertiliser can be created using CCUS and coal. Additionally, at scale use of the Allam Cycle would introduce near-zero emission fossil-fuel and biomass power for Australia and establish new, clean industries - complementing renewables' increasing role in the energy mix.

Mark said that by embracing these technologies it means Australia will not only be able to meet our own obligations but will also mean that we can help our customer nations meet theirs.

"We need to take advantage of what we have in Australia. We have the workers, we have the infrastructure, and we have the resources. There is a universal demand for these technologies and countries all around the world are embracing them. The momentum we're seeing in CCUS advancing globally is a result of government, industry and environmental leaders understanding this and working together to incorporate this important technology into emissions reduction efforts."

Last month, the federal government announced their new \$1 billion Low Emissions Technology Commercialisation Fund, a significant new initiative to incentivise continued low emissions technology development. Alongside the work LETA is doing, the Fund will play an important role in driving the development and deployment of the technologies required to decarbonise Australia.

"It's important that we remember the end goal isn't zero emissions, the end goal is net zero," concluded Mark. "Adapting and changing through technology is how we will continue to solve the world's problems."

The original wall was unveiled by Prime Minister Paul Keating in 1996. However, structural failings of the wall and deterioration of the brass plaques meant an overhaul was needed.

With support from the Mineworkers Trust – our union's charitable foundation - our District has rebuilt the wall with striking black granite plaques to honour and remember coal miners killed in the Northern District Coalfields.

After painstaking research to identify and correct any errors or omissions of names on the previous wall, it now features 1793 names. The names tell a story about the history of coal mining in

our District and the human toll it has taken. The youngest name on the wall is nine-year-old William France, killed at Pacific Colliery and the eldest is 80-year-old William Howes, killed at Abermain Colliery.

We were delighted to invite our Mining and Energy Union General President Tony Maher to officially unveil the wall before an audience of union delegates from across our District.

Tony spoke about the legacy of Miners' Federation legend Jim Comerford, who passed away in 2006 aged 93.

Jim started working in the mines as a pit boy at Richmond Main Colliery in the 1920s aged just 13. His firsthand experience of the brutal Rothbury Riot in 1939 - where police fired on locked out coal miners - reinforced a lifelong commitment to the union and the working class.

Jim was District President of our Union for 20 years from the 1950s through to the 1970s, using his intelligence and commitment to build a strong and effective union that substantially improved working and living conditions for coal miners. We are pleased to honour him with the Memorial Wall and commemorative bust as we endeavour to continue serving coal miners and our mining communities with the same spirited determination.

Tony reflected on the importance of the District's annual Memorial Day at the wall as an event for the community to come together, remember our

history and support grieving families, but as he noted, the Memorial Wall also provides a place of solace and remembrance all year round.

"The fact that it sits in the grounds of the union office in Cessnock but is available to the community all year round means that people can come to Memorial Days or visit in more private circumstances any time that suits. It shows what a gift it is from the Mining Union to the mining community of the Hunter. It is a gift that should live on forever."

Tony's words beautifully sum up the significance of the Memorial Wall to our union and our community.

We were again reminded of the dangerous nature of the coal mining industry with the tragic death of Queensland coal miner Clark Peadon, who was tragically killed at Curragh Mine just two days before we unveiled the restored Jim Comerford Memorial Wall. We held a minute's silence in Clark's honour and we know that his memory will be held dear by coal miners everywhere. May he rest in peace.

Members of Superannuation funds will often have a basic level of Total and Permanent Disability Insurance, often referred to as TPD. Some members will have applied for additional or increased TPD insurance benefits. You pay a premium out of your Superannuation fund for TPD insurance. If you are unsure about what coverage you have it would be sensible to check with your Fund. Total and Permanent Disability benefits may be available to a fund member who has coverage in circumstances where they are unlikely to ever work again. An example of a current definition of TPD includes circumstances where the insured is unlikely to ever work again in employment for which they are reasonably qualified by education, training and experience. It is important to note that definitions vary between Funds and even vary within the same Fund, depending upon when the TPD insurance was taken out. It is recommended as part of your regular financial reviews that you check the definition that applies to you.

Your Fund will have appropriate application forms to apply for TPD benefits and will require certification for your doctors. Once you meet the requirements of the Fund for TPD benefits the amount of the benefit will be credited to your Superannuation account.



Federal law requires that in order to access the benefit you must meet a "condition of release" under the super law. Whilst meeting your funds definition of TPD may also

mean that you meet the condition of release it does not always follow.


TPD Insurance Benefits and definitions may vary from fund to Fund and indeed within the same Fund depending on such things as when you took out coverage, your job classification and whether you have increased your coverage. For that reason check your entitlements with your Fund.

Mining in its simplest form began with Paleolithic humans some 450,000 years ago when our ancestors' extracted pieces of flint from easily accessed outcrops and using crude methods of chipping the flint, shaped them into tools and weapons. While mining has seen vast improvements since these beginnings, for many centuries the only way to dig minerals and rocks from the ground was by hand using primitive tools.

Early miners employed crude methods of ground control,

ventilation, haulage, hoisting, lighting, and rock breakage. The go to tools were hammers, chisels, pickaxes and shovels. Haulage relied on using people or animals to carry materials or to cart them using minecarts and wheelbarrows. Pans were used for placer mining operations, such as gold panning. Hoisting up shafts and inclines was done with a windlass. Timber support systems were employed in tunnels to prevent collapse.

The first challenge for early miners was to break the ore and loosen it

from the surrounding rock mass. Often, their crude tools made of bone, wood, and stone were no match for the harder rock, unless the rock contained crevices or cracks that could be opened by wedging or prying. As a result, they soon devised a revolutionary technique called fire setting, whereby they first heated the rock to expand it and then doused it with cold water to contract and break it. Fire-setting was one of the most effective rock breaking

WITH THE INDUSTRIAL **REVOLUTION AND THE INCREASED** NEED FOR MINERALS, CAME SPECTACULAR IMPROVEMENTS IN MINING TECHNOLOGY, ESPECIALLY IN SCIENTIFIC CONCEPTS AND **MECHANISATION. AMONG THESE NEW TECHNOLOGIES, TWO IN** PARTICULAR CHANGED THE PROCESS OF MINING PROFOUNDLY.

During the nineteenth century, the aforementioned invention of dynamite was the most important advance. In the twentieth century, the invention of continuous mining equipment, which extracts the softer minerals like coal without the use of explosives was perhaps the most notable accomplishment.

Yet despite the many advancements over the last two centuries, traditional mining is still used as a mining method in places around the world such as Colombia, Peru and Niger.

And whilst traditional mining certainly has its disadvantages, it's responsible for creating some of the largest handmade features on Earth, such as the Big Hole open pit mine in South Africa, which is claimed to be the largest hole on Earth excavated by hand.

It just goes to show that some traditions are worth keeping around.



They are young and idealistic and in itself, that is not a bad thing. Civil disobedience has played a major role in the development of fair and enlightened societies and nation states. But the question becomes: have they really thought sufficiently about their cause and the consequences of their actions?

When our activists returned home they'd have given little thought to the luxuries afforded them by a reliable electricity system, the finished products made possible by our minerals deposits, and the wealth our coal exports provide. But they would not have thought at all about the 300 million people in India who tonight, will be without heating, lighting or refrigeration.

THAT'S BECAUSE THEY ARE IDEALISTS RATHER THAN REALISTS. THEIR ARROGANCE IS OUTWEIGHED ONLY BY THEIR IGNORANCE.

Around 160 million tonnes of the world's highest quality coal is loaded through the Port of Newcastle each year. Indeed, the Hunter is exporting more coal at higher prices than ever before. Most of our product is shipped to Asia where wealthy and developing nations alike are using it to generate electricity or to manufacture the steel products so essential to their economies and living standards.

The majority of Hunter coal is thermal product used to generate electricity. Only a small proportion of it is consumed in our local coal-fired electricity generators. The majority goes to fuel the generators of Asia where across China, India, Japan and South Korea alone, 300 new highly efficient coal-fired plants are in the making. Generators which will meet both the household and industrial

needs of their people for decades to come.

One measure of a country's wealth is Gross Domestic Product per head of population. In Australia it's more than US\$50,000 per capita. In China it's less than \$10,000. In India it's less than \$3,000. Those who would have us cease our coal exports, want to keep these people poor. They want to deny our neighbors in Asia the same products on which we built our own wealth.

If successful, they'd only achieve two unhelpful things. First, carbon emissions would grow as our customers turn to suppliers of coal which is less efficient and more polluting. Second, they'd undermine global efforts to reduce poverty, denying our neighbours the tools needed to build wealth and economic stability.

BUT WHAT REALLY MAKES – OR SHOULD MAKE – MAINSTREAM AUSTRALIAN'S ANGRY IS THE LACK OF RESPECT CLIMATE CHANGE PROTESTORS HAVE FOR WORKING PEOPLE.

In the Hunter region, tens of thousands of workers in the coal chain work hard to deliver our coal to market and are proud of the economic wealth they generate in doing so. The foreign exchange their products earn help pay for our hospitals, schools, roads and much more, yet the activists hold them in contempt. It's a disgrace.

In this 21st Century, around 80 per cent of the world's energy comes from oil, gas and coal. They power planes, cars, and trucks. They generate most of our electricity and heating. They power our factories and are the main ingredient in the manufacture of most of the goods and devices we rely upon every day, including the personal protective equipment we've relied on during the COVID-19 pandemic. For the protestors, ignorance is bliss!

The Howes Valley Rural Fire Service (RFS) are cooking up a storm in their newly upgraded kitchen thanks to MTW. During the bushfires a real need was recognised for the 40 plus volunteer firefighters to have a place where they could refuel and recharge between battling blazes, and the newly renovated kitchen provides just that.

For several years, MTW has supported the Samaritans Christmas Lunch in Singleton, 'A Picnic at Singleton Showground'. The annual Lunch is organised specifically for those who may otherwise be unable to celebrate Christmas.

BLOOMFIELD HAS PROUDLY SUPPORTED THE HUNTER COMMUNITY FOR OVER 80 YEARS, AND 2021 WAS NO DIFFERENT.

Its support of the Singleton Neighbourhood Centre continued, with Bloomfield funding the Project Officer who runs the Centre's Open Door program for another year.

Bloomfield's support for Youth Off the Streets (YOTS) now extends well over a decade. This year, underpinned by Bloomfield, YOTS expanded its footprint into the Upper Hunter community, and established a weekly Engagement and Support program at Singleton Heights Sports Centre.

Support for Lifeline also continued, with a recent donation to assist local Lifeline provide free telehealth video counselling, and crisis support via the Lifeline hotline (13 11 14).

And in a new initiative, Bloomfield is supporting the DRIVE program being run by Singleton Police Citizens Youth Club. The DRIVE program trains driving mentors who then help local young people get the supervised learner hours that they need to achieve their drivers licence. Some young people experience barriers to getting their licence including access to a car, and the lack of suitable supervisor drivers. This free program at PCYC helps to remove these barriers for local youth.

DESPITE** THE CESSATION OF COAL MINING, THERE WILL BE PLENTY OF ACTIVITY AT AUSTAR OVER THE COMING YEARS AS YANCOAL UNDERTAKES CLOSURE, REHABILITATION AND RESTORATIVE WORK AT THE SITE IN PREPARATION FOR THE EVENTUAL RELINQUISHMENT OF **AUSTAR'S MINING LEASES.**

The amount of preparation and sophisticated planning that is required to ensure the safe and effective closure and rehabilitation of a mine site is probably a surprise to many in the community. Rehabilitation and closure commitments and obligations are established and enforced under a range of Government regulatory mechanisms, and the planning and execution of works to address these regulatory requirements takes several years.

Yancoal has implemented a rigorous, risk-based and staged approach in planning for closure of the Austar site. Initial activity involves the identification of a range of issues that need to be assessed and addressed, including: closure risks and opportunities; the range of relevant stakeholders to be impacted by closure and rehabilitation activities; likely knowledge gaps within the organisation; and an awareness of legal or other regulatory obligations. During the early stages of the closure process subject matter experts are engaged to

undertake detailed assessments and to develop closure execution plans.

A raft of studies are already being undertaken at the Austar site on issues such as: ground and surface water; the historic heritage of existing structures; emplacement area and tailings dam design; remediation of surface facilities; and mine sealing options.

During this planning period at Austar, Yancoal continues to manage the site in accordance with its environmental compliance obligations and will regularly engage with the community and relevant stakeholders to ensure they are aware of what is happening at site.

Management and monitoring of the site will continue for many years to verify that successful rehabilitation and restoration has been achieved. so that the lease can be relinquished and the land returned to a beneficial post mining land use for future generations.



GLENCORE IS AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST COAL PRODUCER WITH 17 MINING OPERATIONS ACROSS NSW AND QLD AND THE HUNTER IS HOME TO 8 OF THEM. AS YOU CAN IMAGINE, WITH SUCH A LARGE PORTFOLIO THERE WAS A LOT OF GOING ON FOR GLENCORE IN 2021.

Glencore's Asset Management team developed a new Welder Competency Training Program to assist the fabricators, boilermakers and third-party repairers across their operations and the wider industry.

When it came to education, training and career opportunities, Glencore had a variety of programs operating in 2021 such as their Graduate, Summer Vacation and Apprenticeship programs. Their Indigenous Pathway Program was a huge success, with 27 of the original 39 participants completing the 26-week program and 21 gaining employment on completion.



Supported both the Hunter Sustainability Landcare Group and Penguin Garden Club with the purchase of a new mulcher for their community garden.

Along with Mangoola, Liddell purchased 25 new garden beds and other donations for the Sustainability Hub and Community Garden in Muswellbrook. Liddell and Mangoola also organised a working bee with their Maintenance Apprentices to help install them.

MANGOOLA OPEN CUT

Finalist in the NSW Mining HSEC Awards in the Environment Excellence category for their integrating targeted flora translocations in mine rehabilitation.

Mangoola CHPP team achieved the amazing record of 10 years without a single Lost Time Injury (LTI) on January 24, 2021, and that record remains intact.

Mangoola committed over \$85,000 to supporting the local community and surrounding LGA's in 2021, with donations allocated to education, the environment, health, enterprise and local need. In addition, the Mangoola workforce donated more than \$79,000.



RAVENSWORTH

On the corner of the New England Highway and Hebden Road is the old Ravensworth Public School which was unfortunately damaged in 2019 by an arson attack. Together with community members, Singleton Council, an archaeologist and a structural engineer, Ravensworth were able to help repair parts of the building and install educational resources around the site. The school was originally opened in 1876 with just 14 students : 2021 saw the introduction of new mining fleets and is an important historical site.

2021 saw the continued integration and supplementing of Glencore's Greater Ravensworth Water and Tailings Scheme, which also includes Glendell Open Cut. This scheme ensures the Ravensworth operations reuse and recycle as much water on site as possible. By storing water generated on site and optimising its use, there's less water drawn from our local river system which minimises impacts on local tributaries.

UNITED WAMBO JOINT VENTURE

A major milestone for United Wambo Joint Venture was the successful integration of Peabody's Wambo workforce in December 2020 and moving operations to their brand-new facilities in July.

including 4 new excavators and 12 new trucks. Investment in these state of the art machines is a commitment to the future of mining in the Hunter Valley.

As part of their initiatives to enhance cultural awareness among their employees and the wider community they supported the launch of the book 'Spirit of Place – Aboriginal Sites of the Hunter Region' by Uncle Warren, Elder of the Wonnarua people, Hunter Valley.



"Community, momentum and preparation defined our year," chairman Wayne Seabrook said.

"As we managed the post-approval planning process, we focused on our local relationships with community organisations and individuals, which are absolutely vital to our long-term success.

"Through these conversations we were able to provide direct and targeted support for a range of people in our region, many of whom struggled through lockdown."

Malabar donated school supplies to the Singleton Neighbourhood Centre, a not-forprofit organisation providing emergency relief and financial assistance to those in the local area, supporting roughly 20 families juggling the demands of at-home learning due to school closures.

The Scone Community Pantry, which prepares hot meals for struggling families, received \$500 in addition to basic food supplies. Most recently, every student at Jerrys Plains Public School was gifted sporting equipment to help them stay active during lockdown as part of an initiative to improve physical and mental wellbeing.

Extremely challenging market conditions in 2020 and early 2021 prompted the scaling back of production at Wambo Underground, however a commitment to safety, hard work and healthier coal prices have allowed the continuation of mining through the later stages of 2021 into 2022.

Despite tough mining conditions, Wambo's smaller, focused team managed to exceed production targets, complete a longwall relocation, re-start a second continuous miner unit, all while maintaining the best safety performance on record.

From a technical perspective, 2021 saw Wambo's Coal Handling and Preparation Plant undergo an upgrade to improve yield and coal recovery, providing the opportunity for increased production of high energy coal and improved quality and consistency for Wambo's customers.

Their Community and Environment team had another successful year enhancing biodiversity within important offset areas and continuing work on the North Wambo Creek Diversion including the design and construction of four drainage chutes and re-profiling of batters and native revegetation establishment.

A total of 21 grants were made during the current round of funding with projects ranging from the purchase of new technology to installation of additional seating and sun safe equipment, and noticeboard signage.

Kirkton Public School will put the \$14,000 they've

secured towards a vegetable garden, kitchen benches and teacher training and King Street Public School plan to use more than \$10,000 in funding for the time-honoured 'Cracker Night', which has been held within the Singleton community for over 20 years.

The Glencore Schools P&C Grants program has been, and continues to be, a fantastic initiative for our Hunter Valley youth and community.

FACE YOUR FEAR

FEELING SOME DEGREE OF ANXIETY WHEN ANTICIPATING A PAINFUL EXPERIENCE OR FACED WITH POTENTIAL DANGER IS NORMAL, BUT IF YOU HAVE DEVELOPED AN EXTREME FEAR OF A PARTICULAR OBJECT, ACTIVITY OR SITUATION, YOU MIGHT BE SUFFERING FROM A PHOBIA



A phobia is an irrational fear of something that's unlikely to cause harm. The word itself comes from the Greek word phobos, which means fear or horror.

Latest research from the Federal Health Department showed that one in seven Australians, or almost 15 per cent, will develop a phobia or anxiety disorder during their lives. Phobias often start in childhood but can occur at any age and are roughly twice as common among women than men. Over 75 per cent of people with a specific phobia will experience multiple phobias over their lifetime.

Phobias are among several anxiety disorders, which also include panic disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorder and generalised anxiety disorder. Unlike general anxiety disorders, a phobia is usually connected with something specific.

There are more than four hundred types of phobias ranging from common to extremely rare and strange. Such as coulrophobia; the fear of clowns, alektorophobia; the fear of chickens, onomatophobia; the fear of names, pogonophobia;

the fear of beards and omphalophobia; the fear of belly buttons. While some phobias are as old as the hills, others are more recent. For example, there has been a big rise in nomophobia which is the fear of not having your mobile phone on you.

While many phobias have no obvious cause, a number of factors have been linked to the development of a specific phobia such as genetic factors, following a negative or traumatic experience, or after observing another person's fearful response to that same object or situation. Once a specific phobia has developed, a person's

continued experience of fear is thought to occur due to a number of behavioural and cognitive factors such as continued and repetitive unhelpful thoughts about it and avoiding the cause of the phobia, thus unable to develop effective coping skills to overcome it.

A DIAGNOSIS OF SPECIFIC PHOBIA IS MADE WHEN SYMPTOMS ARE PRESENT FOR SIX MONTHS OR LONGER AND CAUSE THE PERSON SIGNIFICANT DISTRESS, OR INTERFERE WITH IMPORTANT ASPECTS OF THE PERSON'S LIFE. SUCH AS THEIR WORK OR RELATIONSHIPS

When it comes to treatment, the most effective method is exposure therapy, where you confront the feared object or situation without engaging in any avoidance or escape behaviours. By facing your fears, it teaches you that feelings of anxiety decrease naturally over time and that the feared consequences of the phobic object or situation are unlikely to occur. Cognitive therapy can also be applied which involves helping you to identify and challenge your unhelpful thoughts. This technique might be used alone or in conjunction with exposure therapy.

Although phobias are common, they don't always cause considerable distress or significantly disrupt your life. For example, if you have arachibutyrophobia, the fear of peanut butter sticking to the roof of your mouth, you can avoid this easily by not eating peanut butter. But if your phobia is interfering with your normal functioning or keeps you from doing things you would otherwise enjoy, it's time to seek help. Now I wonder if the boss will believe that I have ergophobia and can't come to work?

"The success of this pilot program in Weipa, as well as a previous project undertaken at Rio Tinto's joint

venture Resolution Copper Mine in Arizona earlier this year, has positioned Canaria Technologies at the forefront of workplace health and safety innovation" she said.

The pilot program included the deployment of prototype predictive biometric devices across underground mine sites to capture data for use in the prediction of heat stress, man down and cognitive fatigue scenarios throughout ordinary rostered shifts.

The Canaria-V Earpiece works by using a proprietary, real-time predictive biometric algorithm to measure skin temperature, movement, volumetric variations of blood circulation and environmental data, alerting the individual to any cognitive fatigue and heat stress-driven risks before they happen, preventing potentially fatal on-site incidents.

"Our overarching objective is to improve safety for those on the ground while reducing onsite incident frequency, and associated insurance and asset damage costs, as well as optimising incident recovery time for workers affected by heat stress and cognitive fatigue to improve site productivity," Le Souquet said.





As they say drought on the land, drought in the ocean. So what a difference the recent precipitation has made around the area, with things red hot in all areas of fishing.

The rain has really kept the Snapper on the chew around the inshore reefs smashing plastics. Kingfish are starting to turn up in the warmer water as it pushes down as well, it pays to fish a live bait around the reefs this time of year.

Trag and Jew will start showing up with good numbers taking up residence on the deeper reefs.

On the pelagic front, the warm water has been teasing us and is currently sitting wide of Forster. We don't have a lot to report yet other than a fish here and there, but if we were to have a punt we could be in for a Striped Marlin run over the Christmas/New Year period.

INSIDE THE BAY

Flathead and Whiting are smashing lures and baits in the shallows throughout the bay.

Jewfish continue to be plentiful in the holes and around the structure behind Middle Island and around Soldiers Point. Fresh squid or live baits and the trusty vibe lures are proving to be deadly.

It's a similar story to the bay with olenty of Whiting on the Hats and Flathead and Jew are being caught throughout the lake.

Soaking a few pots should find a few Blue Swimmers or Muddies, especially with the runoff from the recent rain pushing out of the lake.

It's Whiting time of year with substantial numbers starting to show up and a few solid Bream in the mix along all our local beaches. The standout being Birubi end of Stockton beach with the fish chewing on beach worms and Pippies.

Jew have been chewing their heads off of late and as we head into summer it's not likely to slow down.

IMPOUNDMENTS

On the rise in more ways than one, the wet cooler weather of late has kept the water temperatures mild and the fish biting well. Bass and Yellow Belly across all the dams reacting well to all kinds of lures and baits.

With some luck the weed growth catches up to the rise in water levels and the edges fire right up once the weather finally warms up for the summer.






